## Postal Administration of the United States of America

**T**HE Postal Administration of the United States of America has informed that:

As a result of new regulations issued by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) under the Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Preparedness and Response Act of 2002, as from 12th December, 2003, all shipments of articles of food to the United States must be preceded by a prior notice of shipment.

This applies to articles shipped for commercial purposes or as gifts. Articles of food include (but are not limited to) food for humans or animals, dietary supplements, nutritional supplements, vitamins, food and colour additives.

Articles of food which are non commercially prepared by an individual in his own residence and sent to another individual as a (non-commercial) gift are exempt from submission of this prior notice.



This prior notice may be submitted and a prior notice confirmation number obtained through an internet address which can be acquired from the General Post Office.

Mail Shipments containing food articles for which a prior notice confirmation number has not been entered on the customs declaration may be returned to the sender or (if no return address is included) destroyed.







## Rookie Fire fighters Commence Duty

As he undertook his first public function as new Minister for Home Affairs and Internal Security, Senator Honourable Calixte George addressed a cadre of graduating fire service recruits, also embarking on a new course in their professional lives. He reminded them that completing training school must be seen as round one of their initiation, into the St. Lucia Fire and Emergency Services.



“The modernisation of the Fire Service entails working in a world where you have advances in science and technology and so the Fire Service has to keep abreast with what is going on in the modern world. The types of equipment that you had before are no longer being manufactured; you have to be able to deal with things that are operated electronically and by computers. So you have to be trained accordingly. And I am very pleased that the young grandaunts were able to absorb the technological advances that you presented to them in the courses that they did.”

Minister George says he was very impressed with the course outline that was used to tutor the recruits and urged them to always practice what they were trained to do

Meanwhile, speaking at the Recruit Graduation, Fire Chief Augustin Gaspard says the training given to the recruits is deliberately designed to equip them to them face the challenges that lie ahead.

“Now that you have graduated, the eyes of the senior officers and indeed that of the public will be upon you. Everyone will be looking forward to see your performances when confronted with the challenges of dealing with emergency situations whether on the fire ground or at the scene of an accident where the services of the ambulance may be required. Your knowledge and skills will then be tested.”

The 19th Recruit Graduation of the St. Lucia Fire and Emergency Services took place on Friday 16 January, at the Fire Service Training Grounds in Vieux Fort. The Fire Service Training School was established in 1976.



## Graduating Recruits Boost Fire Personnel to 220

It is the realization of a milestone for 47 recruits of the St. Lucia Fire Service who will graduate from training school on January 16th, 2004. After fourteen weeks of rigorous training in both theoretical and practical aspects of Fire Science, the recruits will be on the job as early as next Wednesday January 21, 2004.

Divisional Officer Hilton Occulien says the recruits have been equipped with a wealth of knowledge in 35 main subject areas. “They studied the chemistry of fire in-depth. The nature of fire, how fire starts, how it spreads, how fire reacts to different chemicals, all aspects of pumps and pump preparation, hydraulics, fire prevention and many other topics. Among the main areas of interest to the public is the First Responders Course. Every fireman must undergo two weeks of intensive training in First Aid and First Responders’ Level.”

He explained that the standard of training is based on the guidelines from the Service’s international affiliates. “We are affiliated to international bodies like NFPA that’s the National Fire Protection Association and we are also affiliated to the FTA of England and these other bodies and the standards that we follow are pretty much a break down of the international standards that have been sent down to affiliate fire bodies,” Occulien said.

The new recruits bring the man power of the Fire Service to 220 overall. They will be deployed amongst the six fire stations on the island.

THE Laborie Village Council says all is set for the observance of St. Lucia's 25th Anniversary of Independence. ## PM calls on nation to be health conscious

**P**RIME Minister Honourable Dr. Kenny Anthony has sounded an early appeal for persons to adopt healthier lifestyles. The Prime Minister cited ailments most common to the St. Lucian populace such as diabetes and hypertension, as well as HIV/AIDS which can all be minimized or prevented, by practicing responsible and sensible behaviour and habits.

“While I intend to increase the pressure on the Minister of Health to step up the Health Awareness and Education Program of his Ministry, I want to implore everyone to pay closer attention to their diets, to embark on a sustainable exercise and fitness program, and to reduce or eliminate the intake of products that can damage your health.”

The nation’s health sector is currently undergoing intense reform towards optimizing facilities and services that the public can access. According to the Prime Minister, later this year a Task Force will explain a proposed system of Universal Health Care to the general public.
