The issue comprises a set of four stamps as follows:

20c – captures the moment at midnight when the union jack was lowered for the last time and Saint Lucia's Flag was raised for the first time. Standing by is HRH Princess Alexandra (representative of HRH Queen Elizabeth II) with Saint Lucia's first Prime Minister, The Right Honourable John Compton.

95c – depicts a composite of industries including air and sea trade, Tourism, the Banana Industry (representing the Agricultural Sector) and the 'people' represent-

ed by a boy and girl reading the allegorical Book of Knowledge. The square rigged ship depicts the pioneering history of the island when sailing vessels were the only means of communication between nations and Saint Lucia provided a 'safe anchorage for ships' in the Harbour of Castries.

\$1.10 – shows the 25th Anniversary symbol framed in green banana leaves against a mauve background.

\$5.00 – depicts the Castries Harbour with four mega ships berthed alongside the several deep-water wharves of which Sainty Lucia is so famous, ever since the days of steam when the harbour was a bustling coaling depot that ranked 13th in the whole of the British Empire at the time.

Independence Celebrations in New York

PPRIME Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony will on Saturday, February 28, 2004 deliver the feature address at a gala ceremony at Flushing Meadow Park in Queens, New York in observance of St. Lucia's 25th Independence Anniversary.

The independence ball is also being held as a fundraising event for the Desmond George Memorial Scholarship Fund, established to assist needy St. Lucian students in New York. The Mighty Sparrow has agreed to be a guest of honour at this event, which will showcase St. Lucian performances, including a ten member section of the Diamond Steel Orchestra and the calypsonian, Invader.

The gala event is part of a packed independence anniversary programme which starts with a church service on Sunday, February 22nd at 3.00 p.m. at the St. Ignatius Roman Catholic Church. Messages will be delivered on behalf of the Governor General, Her Excellency Dame Pearlette Louisy and Prime Minister, Dr. Kenny Anthony.

A special town hall meeting on the subject of immigration and citizenship will be held on Monday, February 23rd, at 6.00 p.m. The panel of speakers will be led by Mr. Colin Moore, editor of "The Immigrant" journal, and includes St. Lucians working with the United States Immigrant Service and the staff of the St. Lucia High Commission in New York.

On Thursday, February 26th, at 6.00 p.m., Msgr. Dr. Patrick Anthony will deliver a multi-media presentation entitled "The Influence of Derek Walcott and His Generation, On the Social, Cultural and Spiritual Life of St. Lucia".

A Community Awards ceremony is scheduled for Friday 27th at 6.00 p.m., where a number of St. Lucians will be honoured for their contribution to the social and economic development of St. Lucian nationals residing in New York. At this ceremony St. Lucian writers, including John Robert Lee, George Fish Alphonse and Anderson Reynolds will present their work. A launching of the anthology entitled "Roseau Valley" is also planned for this evening. The Diamond Steel orchestra will perform there.

All the events will be held at the St. Ignatius Church Hall on Rogers Avenue in Brooklyn.

A highlight of the anniversary celebrations will be the St. Lucian Independence reception at the United Nations headquarters, where the Diamond Steel orchestra will perform.

St. Lucia's ambassador to the United Nations, His Excellency, Anthony Severin says every effort has been made to work with the wide range of St. Lucian organisations in New York, including the sports organisations, the Mothers and Fathers Groups and the St. Lucia Associations. He stated that there was heightened interest in the activities, and St. Lucians were looking forward for the opportunity to meet to discuss immigration and citizenship and the other issues facing St. Lucian and Caribbean communities in the United States.

Caribbean out Performs Many Region's in E-government Readiness

THE Government of St. Lucia and its counterparts from the Caribbean are well on their way to providing the much needed environment that would make their services more accessible, responsive and cost efficient. St. Lucia's Communications, Works, Transport and Public Utilities Minister, Honourable Felix Finisterre made the disclosure today, as he addressed a three-day regional workshop on E-Government and Sectoral Development at the Cara Suites Hotel in Castries.



Minister Finisterre told the regional grouping that new information and telecommunication technologies (ITCs) were facilitating the acquisition and adoption of information, thereby offering developing states unprecedented opportunities to enhance their education systems, improve policy formulation and execution, while expanding the possibilities for social change.

The Caribbean, he said, had proven itself ready to reap the benefits of E-government Readiness, placing second only to North America with respect to the human capacity index for e-government, while outperforming regions, such as South and Eastern Asia, South-Central Asia, Western Asia, South and Central America, and Europe. "The development of St. Lucia as a service-based or information and knowledge-based economy, therefore, aims at exploiting digital technologies to stimulate the achievement of the country's development objectives," Minister Finisterre said.

He noted that the establishment of a knowledge-based society "was the platform on which the region must foster, accelerate and sustain long-term social, cultural and economic development." He admitted however, that much work still needed to be done to realize the goal of shaping a new economy, predicated fully on information and communication technologies.

Government, the Communications Minister pointed out, was seeking to create an enabling environment to attract local and foreign investors through appropriate policies, legislation and improved public sector efficiency. That note struck a cord with officials of the Commonwealth Secretariat, who are sponsors of the three-day event. "E-government without the culture change becomes expensive government and I think we have to focus not so much on the technology, but on the re-engineering of processes, of regulations, of information and data sharing, and those are always the tough issues," said Henry Alamango of the Commonwealth Network for Information Technology for Development (COMNET-IT)

E-Government is a concept aimed at encouraging governments to use less ink and paper and more electronic information technology in their day-to-day affairs.



General Post Office Addresses Issue of Timely Mail Delivery

BY the end of March, persons residing in rural communities are to register a higher level of satisfaction with regard to the delivery of postal services in their communities.

Assistant Post Master General, Philomen St.Clair says the General Post Office in Castries recently embarked on a project to improve the postal service in rural areas. Phase one of the initiative includes the introduction of a door-to-door service in southern communities, and the installation of community postal boxes to ensure the prompt delivery of letters and bills.

On February 02nd the General Post Office also introduced a lunch-hour service in the Parcel Post Section to facilitate Customs Inspections. Customs Parcel Inspections are also provided at the Vieux Fort and Soufriere post offices.

Reconnaissance Survey of Castries Basin Communities

In an effort to develop project proposals that seek to improve the quality of life of residents in the Castries Basin, the Ministry of Physical Development, Environment and Housing is to embark on a comprehensive reconnaissance survey of the many communities located in the area.

Deputy Chief Surveyor Vincent Jn. Baptiste says the survey will provide the Ministry with critical information to help assess the market value of selected properties bordering the city centre. These properties are the ones located on the slopes surrounding the city and extend from Faux-Au-Chau to upper La Clery, inclusive of the Pavee Lands and Morne-Du-Don.

The exercise will entail a mass appraisal of these areas, "so that government can in the first instance, rationalized these areas and then get an idea as to the monetary value of those properties in the event that a major relocation has to be carried out," said Mr. Jn. Baptiste. The information is expected to go a long way in developing a better appreciation of the housing, land use and related social issues and infrastructure in those communities.

Ultimately the Ministry says the main objective is to develop project proposals that seek to improve the quality of life of residents in the Castries Basin. Meantime, residents in the selected areas are being asked to co-operate fully with Ministry personnel in conducting the survey.



Health Sector Reform Moves Another Notch

TWENTY (20) health centres have been selected for refurbishment , rehabilitation and expansion as part of the component of the Health Sector Reform program geared towards physical infrastructure and outfitting.

This initiative seeks to improve the services offered and delivered by creating an environment conducive to the delivery of quality health services.

Works have commenced on the Babonneau Health Centre with the completion of the physical refurbishment of the existing space (Phase 1). Phase 2 which consists of the expansion of the health centre will commence later this year. This project will be financed by the Basic Needs Trust Fund.

The La Guerre Health Outpost has been constructed to provide health services to the residents of Boguis and its environs after the unavoidable closure of the Boguis Health Centre. This project was financed by the Poverty Reduction Fund.

Other plans include an extension to the Entrepot health centre to house the dental services of the Marchand Health Centre, major rehabilitation works on the Saltibus Health Centre, the Drug Rehabilitation Centre (Turning Point) and the reconstruction of the Vanard health centre. The Ministry of Health is at present reorganizing the space at the Durandeu Community Centre to offer temporary health services to the community. This project will also be financed by the Basic Needs Trust Fund.

Additionally fifteen health centers have also been selected for minor repairs and rehabilitation through a loan agreement with the Caribbean Development Bank for implementation of an Economic Reconstruction Programme with the objective of enhancing the efficiency of the physical operations of the health sector.
