THE Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) is inviting applications from suitably qualified Nationals from its Member States to fill the Senior Management position of Head, OECS Education Reform Unit.

Key duties:

The Head, OECS Education Reform Unit will be responsible for all aspects of management of the OECS Education Reform Unit (OERU) and provide leadership and strategic direction to the staff of the OERU, and provide policy input to the secretariat on sub-region.

In addition the Head of the OERU will:

Facilitate the management and implementation of the OECS Education Reform Strategy through the OECS Education technical Committee (OETEC), and the Education Reform Council of Ministers of Education (ERC);

Lead the development of an Education Knowledge Management Network.

Assume responsibilities for the efficient implementation of all donor-financed programmes and projects executed by the Unit.

More specifically the Head, OECS Education Reform Unit shall:

Plan, convene service and follow up on meetings of the OECS Education Reform Council/Ministers of Education, the OETEC and other technical committees established by the Council;

Work closely with national education officials and managers of donor-funded programmes and projects to develop and coordinate implementation of strategic and operational plans for the advancement of the OECS Education

reform strategy;

Prepare papers, reports and other documentation for the OETEC, ERC, Technical Advisory Committees (TAC) and the OECS Authority in accordance with the agenda as adopted from time to time;

Prepare papers, reports and other documentation for the OECS Authority relating to the implementation of the OECS Education Reform strategy and related activities;

Prepare briefs and position papers for consideration by the Director-General and/or the Director, Social and Sustainable development that relate to development of the education systems in the OECS;

Assume overall responsibility for the management and implementation of donor-financed programmes and projects executed by the Unit; and

Perform such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the Director General/or the Director, Social and Sustainable development.

Qualifications and experience:

The ideal candidate will be a dynamic individual with a proactive approach to management and able to function effectively in a multidisciplinary environment. The successful candidate should also meet the following criteria:

A post-graduate academic qualification in Education Policy and Administration or related field, with at least five (5) years experience in management at a senior policy level.

A sound understanding of the management and administration of programmes and projects and relations with bilateral and multilateral developmental (donor) partners; and

In depth knowledge of the OECS sub-region.

1 Registration And Business Activities





One Stop Automated Internet Kiosks coming to Post Offices

PARTNERING between the public and private sector entities continue to bring to fruition a number of initiatives that aim to enhance the public access to a diverse number of key services. Among the latest initiative to come out of such collaboration is the “Net Stop Automated Services” project which will come into effect at selected post offices later this year. In an interview with the Government Information Service (GIS), Post Master General Ianthe Charlemagne said the project should be completed by the end of July.

Under the project, Gamma Investments and Cable & Wireless have jointly signed an agreement with the Ministry of Communications and Works on behalf of the postal service, to get the project underway. Ms. Charlemagne said the project coincided with the Post Office’s push to bring on board, the latest tools of internet technology in its delivery of services to the public.

The Postmaster General explained that Gamma Investments will install the internet kiosks in order to facilitate customers, who are interested in surfing the web. According to Ms. Charlemagne the kiosks will be installed at Post offices in several communities, including the main Post Office on Bridge Street. She said later in the year the postal service would broaden its internet scope to include services, such as electronic money transfers under a new project of the Caribbean Postal Union slated to come on stream this year.

The Post Master General said that the project would be facilitated via a software developed by the Universal Postal Service known as ‘International Financial Services’ (IFS), which is made available to post offices around the world. In order to offset the cost of implementing the use of this software, the regional postal service is considering implementing the IFS software jointly. In order to access these new services when launched, members of the public will only be required to purchase internet ready cards which will be on sale at all postal outlets.

CBU Chiefs seeking Regional Support

ISSUES affecting the operations of Broadcasters and the development of the media in St. Lucia were the main agenda items, when two officials of the Caribbean Broadcasting Union, the CBU, met with Prime Minister, Honourable Dr. Kenny Anthony recently.

While on island, the Secretary General of the CBU, Patrick Cozier and President Vic Fernandes also met with local CBU Members and non members.

Mr. Fernandes informed that he had sought the support of the Government of Saint Lucia on issues relating to Intellectual Property, while Mr. Cozier pointed to a numbers of media issues that were discussed with CBU members here. Among the issues were the continuation of training programmes for members, changes in the media landscape, licensing procedures, media proliferation, media standards and ethics.

Mr. Cozier referred to two developments in the international arena that will impact on broadcasting in the Caribbean. One of these developments is the World Trade Organisation on a visual protocol. He stated that the necessary steps would be taken to ensure that those protocols were framed within a context that was not only viable but representative of the interest of the Caribbean.

“Secondly, we want to make sure that the new relationship that are being developed in the telecommunications world as a consequence of convergence and as a consequence of digitization, that we are position to take advantage of some of those opportunities that have arisen,” Mr. Cozier said.

The two CBU officials presented copies of two studies to Prime Minister, Dr. Kenny Anthony - “ The Caribbean Code of Ethics” and “ Caribbean Integration: A Media and Communications Plan in Support of the CCJ and CSME.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Hazard analysis and experience have confirmed that Saint Lucia is at risk from numerous hazards, both natural and technological, these include:

Metrological Hazards: hurricanes, tropical storms, tornadoes, storm-surge, floods and drought.

Geological Hazards: earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, landslides.

Environmental Hazards: marine pollution, oil and hazardous material spills.

Transportation Accidents: air – aircraft; land – vehicular; marine – ships.

The role of the National Emergency Management Organisation [NEMO] is to develop, test and implement adequate measures to protect the population of Saint Lucia from the physical, social, environmental and economic effects of both natural and man-made disasters.

Its responsibility is to ensure the efficient functioning of preparedness, prevention, mitigation and response actions.

This Work Programme therefore seeks to promote a comprehensive integrated approach to disaster management by bringing about greater partnership between government, the private sector, non-governmental organisations, donor agencies and regional organisations in an effort to enhance the institutional and human resource capacity, improve national coordination of comprehensive disaster management programmes and activities and provide for the incremental acquisition of the necessary resources.

2.0 CRITICAL ASSUMPTIONS

In order to successfully implement this programme, the following critical assumptions have been made:

That emergencies in Saint Lucia may be categorised in two ways. Those that are preceded by a build-up [slow onset] period, which can provide the National Emergency Management Office with advance warnings, which is used to facilitate timely and effective activation of national arrangements.

That other emergencies occur with little or no advance warning thus requiring mobilization and almost instant commitment of National resources. That the event may require prompt support from Regional and International assistance just prior to or after the onset of such emergencies.

That the Government of Saint Lucia will endorse the programme and seek to provide the financial and human resources and administrative facilitation required for its implementation.

That the private sectors, non-governmental organisations and other donors will provide support in a spirit of partnership.

That the Caribbean Disaster Emergency Response Agency will endeavour to provide technical support, wherever possible, for the programme.

That key government and private sector agencies will continue to develop their individual disaster management plans, support the development of sectoral disaster management plans and provide tangible support to the Director and National Emergency Management Office.

That community disaster management planning will become an integral part of the national effort so as to empower communities to take greater responsibility for their protection and safety.

That the lessons learnt from past hazard impacts would influence the review and updating of disaster management plans and procedures.

3.0 OBJECTIVES

To strengthen the administration of the National Emergency Management Office to provide leadership and coordination in disaster management in Saint Lucia.

To provide specialised training in Disaster Management for local committees.

To provide specialised training in Disaster Management for relevant sectors and agencies.

To educate and inform the population about the hazards facing the island by improving the public education and awareness programmes.

To improve and strengthen the shelter management programme.

To develop and implement a system of Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis following a major hazard impact.

Increase the level of preparedness of the response organisations and the population of Saint Lucia.

Promote the reduction of vulnerability of infrastructure in Saint Lucia.

Strengthen the links with academic and research institutes.



4.0 OUTPUTS

At the end of this programme it is expected that the following would have been accomplished:

A cadre of trained personnel in specialised areas of disaster management.

Established Damage Assessment, Needs Analysis and Relief mechanisms, which would facilitate the identification of damage and needs and orderly distribution of supplies following a hazard impact.

Establish Community Disaster Management System within each constituency with personnel trained to adequately manage disaster/emergency events in their community.

Improved Public Education and Information Programmes about all hazards.

Greater cooperation, coordination and information sharing at the national and regional level.
