POST OF HEAD MACRO-ECONOMIC & SECTOR DEVELOPMENT POLICY STRATEGY UNIT

THE Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) is inviting applications from suitably qualified Nationals from its Member States to fill the Senior Management position of Head, Macro-Economic and Sector Development Policy and Strategy Unit (MESDPSU) within the Economic Affairs Division of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States, St. Lucia.

Key duties:

Under the direction of the Director, Economic Affairs Division, The Head of MESDPSU will be responsible for the supervision and technical management of the unit staff output and unit output and outcomes in the relevant activity areas.

More specifically the major focus of work in this unit will be :

OECS Development Policies and Strategies formulation and implementation - this will include continuous monitoring and review of the OECS Development Strategy at national and regional levels. This will be for the purpose of refining and updating the Strategy to reflect the changing development conditions in the Member States, including the move towards OECS Economic Union. It will also focus on the implementation process of the development strategy.

Specific Sector Policy and strategy development and implementation - this work element will address the specific sectors identified as priority, and will provide for detailed sector level policies to be taken on board by the Member States and by the Secretariat. It will also deal with the implementation processes related to the agreed policies.

Macro-Economic analyses of emerging

development issues - this work element will focus on following international and regional economic developments that will influence the policy choices and responses of the Member States, on a short as well as medium term basis.

Monitoring of fiscal management issues in Member States - this work element will require close collaboration with the ECCB, and will monitor a critical macro-economic variable, i.e., the fiscal stance and the fiscal policies, including budgetary measures.

Interface and interaction with Member States on the above issues.

Interface and interaction with the private sector on development policy issues.

General and specific research and dissemination on issues related to the work of the Unit and Secretariat.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate should also meet the following criteria:

A post-graduate academic qualification in Economics.

Received specialized training in Tourism Development and other relevant subject areas.

At least 10 years experience of progressively responsible professional experience at a senior management level in Government, the private sector, a regional/internal organization or inter-governmental Organisation.

Extensive experience in research and in the provision of advisory services to Governments.

Other Skills:

The incumbent must have an excellent grasp of key policy issues and major trends concerning the economic development of the Caribbean. The incumbent must also have skills in overseeing the work of less senior staff and external consultants.

UPGRADED ECCB BANKNOTES

In accordance with Article 19 (3) of the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank Agreement 1983, the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank gives notice of the upgrade of two security features in the ECCB family of banknotes, in its on-going effort to combat counterfeiting. Upgrades have been made to the security thread and the filigred foil, which are as follows:

Security Threads

The security thread in the upgraded notes fluoresces under UV light, and the letters ECCB as well as the value of the note are visible in yellow, against a blue background on the front of the note. When viewed from the back, the thread appears yellow-green in colour. A second security thread has also been added.

Intaglio Over Filigree Foil

The notes carry a highly reflective silver filigree foil on which the value of the note is evident. The letters ECCB, as well as the denomination are visible in fine print around the foil, which having been over-printed with intaglio, a special banknote process, has a unique "raised" feel.

All other security features remain the same.

The upgraded notes are being introduced into ECCB member countries on a phased basis, as and when stocks of the existing notes are depleted. The current notes continue to be legal tender and will be replaced in the normal way, through wear and tear.

THE Supply Department of the Ministry of Commerce, Investment and Consumer Affairs is inviting tenders for the purchase and importation of wheat flour for the period September 2004 to June 2005. The required specifications are shown hereunder.

Characteristics

Moisture content	not more than 15%
Ash content	not more than 1.2% before adding inorganic matter
Protein content	12 to 13.5%

Packaging Requirements:

Wheat Flour shall be packaged in containers that will safeguard the hygienic, nutritional, and technological characteristics of the flour, and protect it against contamination or absorption of moisture.

Containers shall be made of materials that are safe and suitable for the purpose, such as bags or sacks made of new cotton cloth, multi-wall paper, strong paper and new plastic film.

Containers shall not contaminate the product by migration of any toxic substance, or give the flour any undesirable odor or flavour.

Labeling Requirements:

The labeling on retail packages of flour shall be in the English Language, clearly

and prominently displayed, and readily legible under customary conditions of purchase and use.

The information carried on the label shall include the following:

The name of the food, "Flour", "Wheat Flour" or "White Flour"

Any brand name or trade name

The name of the manufacturer or of the person controlling the brand name or trade name, together with an adequate postal address

The name of the country of origin

The average net contents of each package when packed in terms of units of mass in grams (g) or kilograms (kg), (which may also be shown in avoirdupois pounds and ounces) using Arabic numerals

The batch number, date of manufacture or date of packaging, together with a date of minimum durability (expressed as "Best before end YEAR-MONTH" or "Use before end YEAR-MONTH")

Handling and Storage instructions.

Transportation:

Wheat Flour shall be shipped break bulk or containerized in vessels suitable for transporting foodstuffs for human consumption.

Quality Assurance:

It is required that Wheat Flour be produced in accordance with the compulsory standard for Wheat Flour (SLNS 10: 1992).

Quantity:

One hundred and fifty thousand (150,000) bags of flour or monthly shipments to be agreed between the Supplier and Buyer for a period of ten (10) consecutive months, commencing September 2004.

Weight:

Flour must be packed in strong bags of not more than 50 kg or 110 pounds.

Insurance:

Insurance coverage must provide for settlement of entire amount of lawful claims.

All quotations (C.I.F.) and credit facilities must be forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Commerce, Investment and Consumer Affairs to reach no later than 12 noon on Thursday July 29, 2004.

A Financial Boost for the Youth Enterprise Development Fund

THE Commonwealth Youth Enterprise Development Programme of the Commonwealth Youth Secretariat based in Guyana, has allocated \$100 000 for the establishment of the Youth Enterprise Development Fund in St Lucia.

During a brief presentation ceremony on Monday July 5, Regional Director of the Commonwealth Youth Programme, Armstrong Alexis, described the Commonwealth Youth Enterprise Development Programme as a facility to provide Training, as well as Counselling in Business Development to young persons with an interest in starting their own Businesses. The programme will also offer a Small Loans Programme to provide low cost, easily accessible credit to the Young Entrepreneurs.

Mr. Alexis, who presented the Ministry of Social Transformation with a cheque valued a EC\$100.000 for the initial phase of the programme, is of the view that this initiative is quite opportune at this time, as it targets in particular, the unemployed youth of St Lucia..

“The Commonwealth Youth Programme is very happy to be making this particularly intervention at this time because we think it is important for our young people in St. Lucia to be aware that there is an avenue for them, in terms of their own interest in enterprise and the development of small business in St. Lucia,” Mr. Alexis said.

Minister for Social Transformation, Culture and Local Government, Honourable Menissa Rambally sees this programme as providing an opportunity for unemployed youth to venture into self development. Ms Rambally stated that the Youth Enterprise Development Programme was also aimed at alleviating poverty, with special emphasis on rural communities, where there are young people desirous of getting into business activity.

“There are many young people within our society, who need to begin to see themselves as the future business people of our country, and a programme such as this is providing the initial opportunity for young people, to enable them to do that,” she said.

Prime Minister Anthony indicated that this new programme would empower St. Lucian youth with the means to participate in more social, economic and political activities. The Prime Minister had given the initial proclamation of the establishment of such a programme during his Budget presentation in April this year, when he cited a Budget allocation of \$94,000 for the new initiative.

The James Belgrave Fund, BELFUND, will collaborate with the Commonwealth Youth Programme in disbursing the funds for the programme. Signing of the official documents will take place in the month of August.

Radio CARICOM Launched

RESIDENTS of St Lucia were among the first to listen to RADIO CARICOM, when it hit the airwaves on July 4, 2004. Joined by listeners in Barbados, Belize and Grenada, citizens of these four islands were the first to benefit from this new service provided to members of the Caribbean Community.

Dr. the Rt. Hon. Keith C. Mitchell, Prime Minister of Grenada and Chairman of CARICOM explained at the Opening Ceremony of the Twenty-Fifth Meeting of the Heads of Government of the Caribbean Community, held in Grand Anse, Grenada, on 4 July 2004, that Radio CARICOM was a service that would ensure that Caribbean nationals are kept more abreast of developments within the Caribbean Community. Prime Minister Mitchell explained that although at this stage Radio CARICOM served only four islands, the service would soon be expanded to all Member States.

The Technological and Scientific advancement of the Region was also a primary concern at this 25th meeting of CARICOM. Prime Minister Mitchell stated that the Region should actively pursue the development of alternative energy sources and cooperate on issues relating to these sources.

“Seismic studies have shown, without a doubt, that we have tremendous oil and natural gas reserves in our waters...in our attempt to utilise this untapped resource, we must all work speedily towards settling boundary delimitation agreements among our respective countries.”

As CARICOM Head responsible for Science and Technology, Mr Mitchell expressed the need to strengthen the capacity of the Caribbean Renewable Energy Development Project so that it could focus on utilising the potentials of Solar and Wind Energy. He also called for the establishment of the Common Fisheries Regime, which he said would impact on the sustainability of marine resources not only with respect to fisheries, but also in relation to energy supplies for the Region.

His Excellency Edwin W. Carrington, Secretary - General of CARICOM was very concerned about HIV/AIDS and its devastating impact on Caribbean social life. At the Summit in Grenada, Mr Carrington stated that decisive and sustained regional action was absolutely necessary to successfully deal with the growing problem of AIDS and its debilitating effect on the economic growth of member states.

The CARICOM Secretary General declared that it was time for CARICOM to accelerate the Region's own Integration process. He referred to recent elections held in Europe, and commented on the fact that the Europeans were able to enhance their own integration process and agree on the naming of a New Commission president, Prime Minister Jose Durao Barroso of Portugal. Mr Carrington exhorted the timely implementation of decisions already taken by CARICOM, including the inauguration of the Caribbean Court of Justice and the introduction of the Caribbean Community Passport.

Haiti was still foremost in the mind of The Most Honourable P.J. Patterson of Jamaica, when he addressed the CARICOM Summit. He informed his colleagues that CARICOM was actively advocating Haiti's case for substantial financial resources from the World Bank, the Inter - American Development Bank, the European Union, and that CARICOM was even considering Haiti's participation in the Caribbean Development Bank.

With preparations for Elections already underway in Haiti, the Community Council of Ministers had its Second Special Meeting on July 3, 2004, to review an update on Haiti provided by the CARICOM Secretariat. At this meeting, chaired by the Hon. Elvin Nimrod, Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Trade of Grenada, the Community Council also received an update from Jean-Yvon Simeon, Minister of Foreign Affairs in the Interim Administration in Haiti. Mr Simeon responded to questions posed by the Council Ministers on a number of political, economic and social issues, as well as on matters of security, human rights and the state of the Judiciary.

Govt Welcomes Beausejour's Selection as a 2007 Cricket World Cup Venue

"IT'S a Great Day for St. Lucia," says Acting Prime Minister Mario Michel

Acting Prime Minister Mario Michel says St. Lucia's selection as a venue for the Cricket World Cup just two years after construction of the Beausejour Cricket ground is "yet another major achievement for the island."

"It's a great day for St. Lucia," the Minister said, noting that the announcement came less than a week after St. Lucia's world famous twin peaks, The Pitons, were declared a World Heritage Site by the United Nations.

Mr Michel said St. Lucia's successful bid was the result of "a combination of foresight, years of hard work and special preparation on the part of the Government of St. Lucia and the local Bid Committee."

Commenting minutes after Monday morning's announcement of the eight venues selected by the International Cricket Council (ICC), Mr Michel, who is also Minister with responsibility for Education, Human Resource Development, Youth and Sports, said it was "also the result of years of hard work that started back in 1998."

He recalled that 1998 was the year "when a decision was taken not to rehabilitate the Mindoo Philip Park, but to work towards establishing a world class venue for cricket in St. Lucia."

That decision, he recalled, was followed by another taken in 2000 to have architects draw up a design for the Beausejour Cricket Ground, and then there was the eventual commissioning of our new national cricket facility of international standards in 2002."

He continued: "The hosting of first class, world-class cricket matches at Beausejour following its commissioning, the establishment of the high-powered Bid Committee and the meticulous planning that went into our bid effort, all contributed to today's success."

"To have been selected as a venue for World Cup Cricket just two years after constructing the Beausejour Cricket Ground," Mr Michel noted, "is not just a signal honour, but also a great tribute to our collective, team efforts."

Mr Michel said he was "not surprised" that St. Lucia was selected as a venue and paid special tribute to the late Chairman of the St. Lucia Tourist Board, Mr Desmond Skeete, "who, as Chairman of the Bid Committee, contributed significantly to the success of the Committee's work at home and abroad."

According to the Acting Prime Minister: "The entire Cabinet of Ministers joins with the rest of the country in celebrating the successful bid, and we look forward to even more good news next Tuesday (July 14) when the announcements will be made regarding what matches will be played where."

Tourism Minister Urges Business Community to Make Use of Incentives for Cricket World Cup Accommodations

MINISTER of Commerce, Tourism, Investment and Consumer Affairs Hon Philip J. Pierre says the entire tourism fraternity is very pleased with the announcement that the island will be a World Cup venue. He also urges the local business community to make use of generous incentives offered by the Government for accommodating the thousands expected to visit for the events.

Recalling the announcement by Prime Minister Dr Kenny D. Anthony in his last Budget Address of a package of incentives for consideration by the business community in preparation for hosting an expected 30,000 to 40,000 visitors, Mr Pierre said: "It now remains for us to be able to take advantage of the incentives offered to be able to reap the touristic and economic benefits to be accrued from this decision."

Citing the benefits to the island's tourism product, the Tourism Minister noted that "over 1.4 billion people will be able to see and hear about St. Lucia for 51 days on their TVs, radios, Internet and newspapers."

"That," he added, "will be a tremendous boost for the island as a place to be visited."

St. Lucia and Barbados made a joint bid for hosting the World Cup and both venues are among the eight selected. The others are: Antigua and Barbuda, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis and Trinidad and Tobago.

The minister spoke minutes after the announcement of the selected Caribbean venues by the International Cricket Council on Monday morning.

The CCJ: an affirmation of "our Independence and Sovereignty."

JAMAICAN Prime Minister P J Patterson, in his address to the Joint Session of Parliament on July 1, 2004, in Castries stated that the next big step for Regional Development related to the implementation of the Caribbean Single Market and Economy (CSME) and the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ).

According to Prime Minister Patterson, the CSME provide an expanded "domestic market", a building block for CARICOM integration into the wider trade arrangements, such as the Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA). The Community arrangement enabled individual countries, such as St. Lucia and Jamaica to overcome some of the challenges of small size, by pooling resources and coordinating positions.

The Jamaican Prime Minister stated that an important arm of CSME was the provision for the establishment of a Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ). He then commended St. Lucia for having been one of the first member states to have passed the enabling legislation, whereas in Jamaica, debates were still ongoing.

Mr. Patterson agreed with St Lucian Prime Minister, Kenny Anthony that the CCJ was an "affirmation of our independence and sovereignty." Prime Minister Patterson said that Caribbean territories could not continue to rely on others to determine and interpret their own Laws and Constitutions. He pointed out further, that there was no viable alternative to the CSME and the CCJ, and that he looked forward to the implementation of the CCJ later this year, and to the full implementation of the CSME by 2005.

Prime Minister Patterson assured that he would continue these discussions with his colleague heads at the upcoming CARICOM summit in Grenada. He revealed that the agenda for this meeting included issues pertaining to the Region's future relations with Haiti and a review of the operations of the CARICOM Task Force responsible for the coordination of assistance to the people of that nation.
