**TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS: SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PROJECT
FEASIBILITY STUDY AND DESIGN

The Government of the Turks and Caicos Islands (GOTCI) has applied for a Technical Assistance (TA) Loan from the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) to assist in financing consultancy services to conduct feasibility studies for an interated solid waste management (SWM) system for the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI) and to provide detailed cost estimates and designs. GOTCI, through the executing agency, The Department of Environmental Health, invites the submission of Statements of Capability from consultants or joint ventures of consultants interested in providing services for the required feasibility study and design work for the SWM project in TCI.

The scope of work will include the design of improved collection, transportation and disposal systems on Grand Turk and Providenciales, an assessment of the regulatory and institutional framework for SWM in TCI, an evaluation of economic and, financial feasibility of the project with a view to full cost recovery; and an assessment of the project costs including environmental and social impact mitigation costs. The services will be carried out in two phases. In Phase 1, the consultants will undertake preliminary designs conduct feasibility studies, including environmental and social impact

assessments and institutional assessments. In Phase 2, the Consultants will be required to prepare final designs and cost estimates including construction drawings and specifications, and Bills of Quantities. Further details of the project can be obtained from the first address below.

The undertaking of the services under Phase 2 will be contingent on the approval by GOTCI and CDB of the recommendations arising out of Phase 1.

GOTCI now invites eligible consultants to submit Statements of Capability to undertake the subject consultancy. In the assessment of submissions, consideration will be given to the technical competence, qualifications and experience, local and regional experience on similar assignments, financial capability and extent of commitments. All information shall be submitted in the English Language.

Consultants shall be eligible for procurement if:

DECLARATION of Special Enforcement Area Pursuant To Section 43 (1) of the Physical Planning and Development Act No.29 of 2001.

IN THE MATTER of a Declaration by Cabinet that a section of the community of La Fargue in the quarter of Choiseul in the State of Saint Lucia is to be declared a Special Enforcement Area.

DECLARATION

WHEREAS, Section 43 (1) of the Physical Planning and Development Act No. 29 of 2001 states that the Minister may declare any area to be a Special Enforcement Area for the purpose of preventing squatting or other forms of unauthorized development and cause a Declaration to that effect to be made.

AND WHEREAS, the Minister considers it necessary that the lands mentioned and described in the Schedule shall be a Special Enforcement Area for the purpose of preventing squatting or other forms of unauthorized development.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby declared by the Minister that upon the publication of this Declaration in the Gazette, the lands mentioned in the Schedule shall be Special Enforcement Areas for the purpose of preventing squatting or other forms of unauthorized development.







Cabinet gives the Nod to NEC Report

THE Cabinet of Ministers, accompanied by members of the Committee of Permanent Secretaries, met with the National Economic Council (NEC) on Friday, 6th August 2004 in the National Insurance Corporation's Conference Facility, to receive the Inaugural Report of the NEC.

The presentation by the NEC, led by its President, Richard Peterkin looked at the Development Framework within which it operated, articulated the need for an integrated strategic development approach, and identified sector specific initiatives and cross sector strategies for stimulating the economy in the immediate to short term.

Members of the Cabinet of Ministers questioned the NEC on issues raised in the report and sought clarification on some of the recommendations and strategies proposed.

There was a general consensus among the Cabinet members that the report was a good one, and that further dialogue with some specific sectors was required in order that it may be informed by current Government initiatives.

The meeting ended with an agreement to continue the discussion at a follow-up meeting with the Committee of Permanent Secretaries and another with the Cabinet, to respond to the issues which were raised.

PM Calls for Establishment of Global Fund for Youth Development

PRIME Minister, Dr Kenny D. Anthony has challenged the Commonwealth Secretariat to establish a global fund for youth development.

The call came as the Prime Minister addressed a signing ceremony on Monday (August 9) for formal agreements for establishment of the Youth Enterprise Development Fund.

The Youth Enterprise Development Fund was first announced in the Prime Minister's Budget Address earlier this year, and this morning marked the formal signing of a Memorandum of Understanding and a Financial Agreement between the Commonwealth Secretariat and the Government of St. Lucia, for the transfer of funds for establishment of the fund.

Speaking on behalf of the Commonwealth Secretariat, Deputy Secretary General of the Commonwealth, Mrs Florence Mugasha, acknowledged what she described as the sound stewardship, leadership, inspiration and vision of the St. Lucia Prime Minister and his demonstrated interest in the future of young people.

Mrs. Mugasha said Prime Minister Anthony was well known at the Commonwealth Secretariat for his interest in ensuring that youth perspectives are brought to the fore.

The Deputy Secretary General noted that between 1996 and 1998, St. Lucia had the highest rate of unemployment among youth, and said it was therefore, commendable that the initiative was being launched at this time, to enable young persons to contribute successfully to their own development.

For his part, Prime Minister Anthony noted that unemployment in St. Lucia was worsened by the steep decline in the fortunes of the banana industry, as well as by the ravages of global competition and its effects on the manufacturing sector.

He recalled that in its search for opportunities and alternatives for youth employment and development, the Government of St. Lucia had taken several early initiatives, including the establishment the James Belgrave Enterprise Development Fund (BELfund) and the National Skills Development Centre (NSDC). He also cited the Youth Apprenticeship Programme (YAP) identified in the last Budget Address, and work towards which is already under way.

Prime Minister Anthony noted that it was impossible for any government to create or provide jobs for all unemployed persons, and in this regard, the Government of St. Lucia had decided that one way to go was to provide opportunities for those interested in self-employment.

The Prime Minister said the \$100,000 to be made available to the Youth Enterprise Development Fund through the Commonwealth Youth Programme was quite welcome. He said this seed money would definitely have to be supplemented by local funds.

However, given the continuous need for such programmes, the Prime Minister called on the Deputy Secretary General of the Commonwealth to suggest to her peers at the Commonwealth Secretariat, that a special Global Fund for Youth Development be established to assist the young people in other developing countries throughout the international grouping.

Such an approach, Dr Anthony added, would help give more purpose and direction to the young people of the region and the world.

The Youth Enterprise Development Fund will be specifically targeted at youth between the ages of 18 and 29 and it will be jointly administered by the Ministry of Social Transformation, along with other such entities as the BELfund, the NSDC and the National Youth Council (NYC).

Monday morning's ceremony was also attended by Minister for Education, Human Resource Development, Youth and Sports, Hon Mario Michel, as well as Minister for Social Transformation, Hon Menissa Rambally. Other officials in attendance included representatives of the Commonwealth Secretariat, the Commonwealth Youth Programme, the BELfund and other associated local entities.
