THE Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries wishes to inform the public that it will be authorizing a three week islandwide harvest period for white sea urchins (sea eggs) from the 6th September 2004 to 26th September, 2004 (both days inclusive).

To ensure that the sea egg population is not over harvested, and that juveniles (young sea eggs) remain for the benefit of future harvest, all harvesters are required to adhere to the following conditions:

Persons must harvest only eggs that are at least 3.5 inches (9.0 cm) in diameter (measured at the widest length across the body of the animal);

No one is to harvest in any Marine Reserve such as the Maria Island Nature Reserve and the reserves within SMMA and CAMMA;

No Scuba gear is to be used for harvesting of sea urchins;

All sea urchins must be brought to shore for breaking and processing (no activities are to be carried out at sea);

All persons who operate as "cleaners" must bury urchin shells on a daily basis, placing them above the high tide mark and covering them with at least six inches of sand;

All harvesters and cleaners must make available to the Department of Fisheries any data on sizes, weights and/or numbers as requested;

All persons wishing to export any sea urchin gonads must obtain permission from the Department of Fisheries and a health certificate from the Veterinary Division of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries.

Persons failing to adhere to the above conditions will be liable to a fine of up to five thousand dollars (\$5000.00), as stipulated by the Fisheries Regulations No. 9 of 1994 Section 36(a).

The Department of Fisheries will be conducting monitoring activities islandwide to obtain an estimation of the landings during this open period and will be working along with the Police Department to ensure that all persons

abide by the harvest conditions stated above.

All harvesting activities must cease after this stated period. No persons are allowed to have in their possession or expose for sale any sea urchins after the closure of the harvest period. Harvesters and the general public are hereby urged to observe and comply with the aforementioned conditions.





Justice Albert Matthew to Investigate

THE Office of the Prime Minister wishes to announce the appointment of retired Justice of the OECS Supreme Court, Justice Albert Matthew, to conduct the investigation into the circumstances relating to the property at 438 East 49th Street, Brooklyn, New York, or what is commonly referred to as the Helenites Building.

Justice Matthew is a regional legal luminary, having served as a High Court Judge in Antigua, Dominica, St. Kitts/Nevis, St. Lucia and St Vincent with specific assignments in Montserrat and Anguilla. During his tenure as a Justice of Appeal of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court, between 1997 and 2001 he wrote several leading Judgments of the Court.

Since his retirement in August 2001, he has undertaken a Special Assignment in the High Court of Justice in Tortola, B.V.I; Acted Chief Justice, Turks and Caicos Islands.

In Dominica, at present, he serves as Chairman Education Appeal Tribunal; Chairman Physical Planning Appeal Tribunal; Chairman Independent Monitoring Group to monitor country's performance under the Economic Stabilization Programme.

Justice Matthew is currently a Member of the OAS Administrative Tribunal



Plane Crash Simulation: Testing the Readiness of Airport Officials

THE residents of Vieux Fort in the south of the island are being told not to be too alarmed when a full scale plane crash simulation gets underway at the Hewanorra International Airport on September 15, 2004. Director of the National Emergency Management Office (NEMO), Ms. Dawn French said the simulation will culminate a series of ongoing briefings on Emergency Operation Centre Management (EOC).

"It's a workshop to show the staff of Hewanorra International who will be in the EOC when something happens at the airport exactly how to set up the office and the kind of pressures they can expect. Psychological, pressures from the press, the families or just doing a response and so we will be going through that over the three days of the workshop."

According to Ms. French the simulation exercise has to be conducted every two years in compliance with international regulations. "As we get towards the simulation date on the 15th, we have a series of international evaluators who will begin arriving. The first one arrives on the ninth to start putting together because so locals will be evaluating this simulation because we are all role players so we can't evaluate ourselves."

The simulation of a plane crash will take place in collaboration with the medical sector, and the emergency services, including the police and fire department.

New Academic Year begins September 1st, 2004

MINISTER of Education Human Resource Development, Youth and Sports Honourable Mario Michel is urging parents to send their children to school on Wednesday, September 1st, 2004 – commencement of the new academic year. The Minister has promised that children will be supervised in the event teachers do not turn up for school.

The Minister is appealing to parents to do the right thing and send their children to school rather than allow them to be absent for the first day of school. Speaking in a radio address on Tuesday, September 31, Minister Michel said, "I have no doubt that there are some teachers who will opt not to come to school tomorrow and will instead go to a Union meeting called on a school day with no authorisation sought from or given by the Ministry of Education. But equally, I have no doubt that there will be many committed and dedicated teachers at school tomorrow, who would not even contemplate the thought of leaving their students unattended a union meeting."

The Ministry of Education and the Saint Lucia Teachers Union are at an impasse over the reopening of school for this academic year. "This Minister and this government have never sought to be unfair or unkind to the teaching profession in Saint Lucia. Yes we have sought and will continue to seek to push as hard as we can to give the children of this country the best education that our meagre resources can provide. And yes there are times when this push can appear to put more pressure on teachers as it does on the students and on parents too. But it is only by pushing as hard as we have, that we have made the progress that we have in recent years, which we as policy makers, administrators, principals, teachers, students and parents are all proud of," he said.

Minister Michel is again reiterating that as Minister for Education, he has and will continue to play his role and it is now up to parents to do their part: "In any event, my mission is not to defend myself. I continue to assert that I cannot force teachers to attend school on any particular day, nor can I force parents to send their children to school on any particular day, but I have done what is my duty and responsibility as Minister of Education. I hope you will do yours tomorrow."
