



More EU Assistance to Saint Lucia

THE European Union has given the green light for the funding of a pipe borne water and water sanitation project, which will help address the problem of water shortage and water sanitation in depressed communities. This was revealed by National Authorising Officer in the Office of the European Development Fund, Wilfred Pierre.

“As you know, we have serious problems as it relates to water, especially in the Dennery area, and the EU is about to implement a close to 250 million euros fund for water, which will look at providing tap water for depressed communities and looking at sensitization to basically, sanitation problems.”, he said.

This announcement was made after a press conference on Monday September 21st, 2004. The EU officials are presently on the island, conducting a Portfolio Review of EU funded projects.

The delegation is headed by Mr. Amos Tincani, the representative for Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean. He said that Saint Lucia stood to benefit from the EU-funded programmes, as the Union was focussing on the implementation of the new hospital project, a major priority of the organisation.

“We are also present in the health sector to a very large extent through the new hospital. The country is in fact defining its new health policy. It’s a very major new development and by next year, we will be able to formally approve the funds for the new hospital and for the implementation of the health strategy.



Saint Lucia Fire Service 30th Anniversary Activities Ends On a Positive Note

THE St. Lucia Fire Service has captured the first ever Caribbean Association of Firefighters Clico Goodwill Games title.

Fire fighting teams from Dominica, Barbados and Trinidad and Tobago were here over the weekend, to participate in the friendly competition, and to join in recognising the achievement of servicemen and women, as they were awarded at the Banquet and Awards Night, held under the patronage of Her Excellency Governor General Dame Pearlette Louisy.

Minister for Home Affairs and Internal Security, Senator the Honourable Calixte George believes the public is impressed with the level of professionalism and commitment displayed by fire officers: “I have no doubt those persons receiving awards tonight are among many, who have worked very hard over the years to ensure that the fire service provides an efficient and effective service of very high quality to Saint Lucia. Your efforts I am sure have been focussed, they have been consistent and industrious”.

Conspicuously absent from the wards ceremony were the Grenadian representatives, who had earlier accepted an invitation for the occasion. A moment of silence was observed in remembrance of the people and fire-fighters of Grenada, who earlier this month suffered at the deadly passage of Hurricane Ivan.

Saturday’s event held at the Gaiety in Rodney Bay was the culmination of activities throughout the month of September, marking the 30th Anniversary of the Saint Lucia Fire and Ambulance Service.

Saint Lucia inches closer to CSME Compatibility

THE Government of Saint Lucia is inching closer to meeting its commitments to the CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME). The island is at various stages of giving CSME protocols force of law, having passed legislation for the free movement of persons, facilitation of travel, and the implementation of the Common External Tariff.

Saint Lucia and the rest of the region have a schedule of legislative programmes to institute ahead of the January 1st 2006 deadline for the CSME to come into effect.

External Trade Advisor in the Ministry of External Affairs, International Trade and Civil Aviation Mr. Calixte Leon says it is a heavy schedule but St. Lucia has moved to adopt a number of the CSME protocols. The External Trade Advisor says, "we have accomplished quite a bit for example Saint Lucia has now signed and ratified the agreement with respect to the revised treaty of Chaguaramas. We've also enshrined that treaty into domestic legislation as recent as July 2004. In respect of the Caribbean Court of Justice we have also signed and ratified the agreement and put into domestic law the requirements for giving birth to the Caribbean Court of Justice".

Saint Lucia has also ratified and signed the CARICOM Regional Organisation for Standards and Quality as well as the Intra-Regional Double Taxation agreement but has not yet put these into local law.

This and other areas of the CSME legislative agenda are receiving attention and the island will continue to move in earnest towards the 2006 deadline. "We have done a substantial amount of work, there is still a lot to be done, I believe we can achieve that deadline, but let me hasten to add here the pace is not as quick in all CARICOM States but, we have made significant progress", Leon said.

Last week Prime Minister Honourable Dr. Kenny Anthony, Chairman of the National CSME Task Force met with members to discuss the progress the island was making towards 2006. Dr. Anthony says a priority of the task force is ensuring that all of Saint Lucia is made to understand the process. As such a massive public awareness campaign is expected to be initiated in the coming weeks to inform Saint Lucians of the opportunities and challenges of the CSME.



Grenada Fire and Ambulance Service receive assistance from their local counterparts

THE Saint Lucia Fire and Ambulance Service is in the process of preparing to give assistance to their counterparts in hurricane ravaged Grenada. Local Chief Fire Officer Mr. Augustin Gaspard who is also the President of the Caribbean Chief and Acting Chief Fire Fighters Association – CADAFCO, explained that all affiliates to the regional body are being sensitized on the plight of their fellowmen in Grenada.

"We don't want to just be sending things like everybody is doing where probably they may have a special need so what we are trying to get in touch with them to identify their special area of need which we will be responding to but they have already some funds identified for that process."

Meanwhile, as part of raising awareness of the fire and ambulance service Divisional Officer of the Saint Lucia Fire Service Hilton Occulien is calling on the public to be mindful of the confusion which can be caused by the use of ring tones on cell phones which imitate the sirens on the emergency services vehicles. Mr. Occulien says the indiscriminate and irresponsible use of the facility reserved for emergency services will impact how people respond to sirens in the future. "We need to understand those things yes we are have these modes on our phone but we have to look at if we are using it, when and where because it can also become a nuisance if misused."

NCF makes Secondary and Tertiary Education possible for more young people

RECIPIENTS of scholarships from the National Community Foundation (NCF) have been reminded of difficult times in Saint Lucia when a lack of financial resources was preventing a lot of people from pursuing an education. Speaking at the formal presentation ceremony of NCF scholarships for the 2004/2005 academic year on Monday September 13, 2004, Chief Education Officer Ms. Fortuna Anthony Husbands called on the students to recognise that while education is a priority of the state, it should also be their individual priority.

"It is well recognised that there are many students who have potential to excel but who come from homes that are financially depressed. Before you would not have the opportunity to receive a scholarship but today the National Community Foundation opens up the opportunity for you to access secondary as well as tertiary education."

Ms. Husbands believes that now is the time for the students to look beyond their socio-economic background to focus on realising their goals. "You have seen the financial freedom in terms of books, uniforms, transport and lunch money, now is your turn to pursue your full potential. Do not allow yourself to be distracted and lose focus. That happens very, very often with our younger students."

The NCF awarded a total of 20 scholarships, 16 of which were awarded to students who successfully wrote the 2004 Common Entrance Examinations, and 4 to students attending the Sir Arthur Lewis Community College.



Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony pledges Support for Grenada

PRIME Minister Honourable Dr. Kenny Anthony visited Grenada Sunday September 12th, five days after the passage of Hurricane Ivan which blasted the island.

Describing the scenes he confronted in Grenada Dr. Anthony said it was unimaginable destruction never before seen in the Caribbean. He said while Saint Lucia lived through Hurricane Allen a dangerous storm, it does not compare to Hurricane Ivan in Grenada.

Dr. Anthony and Prime Minister of St. Vincent and the Grenadines conducted a joint visit of the island. The two Prime Minister's met with a shaken Grenada Prime Minister Dr. Keith Mitchel still reeling from the shock of the scale of the disaster.

Dr. Mitchel told his colleagues his immediate priorities was to restore security, rebuild housing and feed the thousands of Grenadians who have been displaced after the storm.

Hurricane Ivan is the most dangerous hurricane to hit the Caribbean. Forty-six deaths were recorded in the spice island. The hurricane slammed everything in its path, levelling homes, knocking down power lines and trees.

Dr. Anthony says it will take a lot of resources to begin the process of rebuilding the island. The Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) and the World Bank visited the island in the immediate aftermath of hurricane Ivan and have pledged support for the recovery effort through loans and grants.

The CDB made available US\$100,000 to the Caribbean Disaster Emergency Recovery Agency (CDERA) for immediate relief supplies for Grenada and has made available a US\$500,000 dollar loan facility to each island struck by Ivan.

Prime Minister Dr. Kenny Anthony says what Grenada needs now is not more loans in managing its economic recovery following hurricane Ivan. He says there must be a readiness to provide grants which would not burden the island as it seeks to recover from the worst disaster ever experience in the Caribbean region.

Forty six Grenadians died as a result of hurricane Ivan, the island's infrastructure received a battering with the islands two stadium demolished. All communication was cut, and there were reports of widespread looting.

Dr. Anthony says with the disaster in Grenada has come the need for a revamping of the Regional Security System RSS. The RSS proved to be a big asset in Grenada in the aftermath of the storm which crippled the operations of the Royal Grenada Police Force.
