Post of Chief Medical Officer / Director of Primary Health Care

Job Purpose:

The post holder will be the senior health professional on the island. He/she will be responsible for assessing health needs, maintaining information systems on health and using this information to advise the Ministers and the Executive Council on the arrangements for prevention and treatment of disease and for the care of those with long term disabilities. In addition, he/she will direct and manage the primary care services and will advise on professional medical matters.

Key Responsibilities:

Develop and maintain a strategy for health care, appropriate to the needs of the community, which takes account of the specific risks and needs of Montserrat and which can be delivered within the available resources. The strategy will be presented to, and endorsed by, the Executive Council annually.

Maintain oversight of secondary care by providing professional supervision of clinical practices and advice to the Secondary Care Manager.

Report on the health of the community by means of an annual report to the Executive Council which follows the format used by the Pan American Health Organisation.

Advise the Minister and the Permanent Secretary on the arrangements required to implement the health strategy and annual report and to manage their implementation as approved by the Minister.

Provide health and medical advice to the Government as appropriate.

Support the Permanent Secretary

(Health) as a major contributor to meetings of Ministry officials and by advising on value for money in health care. Support this by developing appropriate health adult and evaluation procedures.

Review the law underpinning health and medical practice and advice on ways in which it can be made more effective.

Communicate with all sectors of the community on health matters in order to advise them and to obtain their views on needs and on the quality of service delivery.

Maintain effective professional links with relevant health organisations and individuals outside Montserrat for the purpose of referring patients, exchanging information and health staff, maintaining awareness of current best practice and securing their assistance when required.

Key Responsibilities (Chief Medical Officer):

Advise the Governor on the registration of medical practitioners and other health professional to ensure that registration is based on criteria, which are soundly based and available for applicants.

Regulate the conduct of the medical profession in Montserrat, seeking external advice if required for fair resolution of any disputes.

Register and licence health sector organisations to operate on the island in order to ensure that standards of health care are maintained.

Discharge the statutory duties of the Chief Medical Officer as specified.

Advise on the recruitment of medical staff for the Ministry of Health.

Act as head of profession for government medical staff, advising on training requirements, conditions of employment, and future resource needs.

Key Responsibilities (Director of Primary Health Care) :

Work with the other members of the primary health care team to develop policies and programmes, which will ensure the efficient and effective delivery of primary health care.

Specify the requirements for secondary health care services needed to provide support for a primary care led service.

Manage the delivery of primary care programmes and services to the community, including nursing, psychiatry, health education, dental and environmental health and be accountable to the Permanent Secretary for the delivery.

Ensure that the needs of special groups such as children, pregnant women, the elderly, those with chronic non-communicable diseases and those with physical and mental disabilities are met.

Protect the Public health by management of effective and appropriate environmental health programmes.

Achieve those Objectives by developing the skills of primary care staff.

Personnel Specifications:

A medical degree (that can be registered in Montserrat) with appropriate qualifications in a relevant medical specialty (FRCS, MS, MPH, MRCP, DM or equivalent). In addition, membership in an appropriate international public health organization, for instance American Public Health Association or any other appropriate organization would be a distinct asset;

A minimum of three years experience in program development, strategic planning an operational management of community-based, primary health care programs and services;

Outstanding leadership, organizational, administrative and interpersonal skills with experience in a related position of operational management of health care personnel and services;

The Government of St. Lucia has received a loan (hereinafter called the "loan") from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (hereinafter called the Bank) and a credit from the International Development Association toward the cost of the St. Lucia OECS Education Development Project and it intends to apply part of the proceeds of this loan and credit to payments under the contracts for the procurement of school furniture, divided into 5 lots, for four existing and two new secondary schools. Bidding is open to all eligible source countries as defined in the Guidelines: Procurement under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits.

The Government of St. Lucia, herein represented by the Ministry of Education, Human Resource Development, Youth and Sports, now invites sealed bids from eligible and qualified bidders for the supply of school furniture for four existing and two new secondary schools.
