

TECHNOLOGY

Technology can be most broadly defined as the entities, both material and immaterial, created by the application of mental and physical effort in order to achieve some value. In this usage, technology refers to tools and machines that may be used to solve real-world problems. It is a far-reaching term that may include simple tools, such as a crowbar or wooden spoon, or more complex machines, such as a space station or particle accelerator. Tools and machines need not be material; virtual technology, such as computer software and business methods, fall under this definition of technology.

The word "technology" can also be used to refer to a collection of techniques. In this context, it is the current state of humanity's knowledge of how to combine resources to produce desired products, to solve problems, fulfil needs, or satisfy wants; it includes technical methods, skills, processes, techniques, tools and raw materials. When combined with another term, such as "medical technology" or "space technology", it refers to the state of the respective field's knowledge and tools, and "state-of-the-art technology" refers to the latest high technology available to humanity in any given field.

Science, engineering and technology

The distinction between science, engineering and technology is not always clear. Science is the reasoned investigation or study of phenomena, aimed at discovering enduring principles among elements of the phenomenal world by employing formal techniques such as the scientific method.[5] Technologies are not usually exclusively products of science, because they have to satisfy requirements such as utility, usability and safety.

Engineering is the goal-oriented process of designing and building tools and systems to exploit natural phenomena for practical human means, using results and techniques from science. The development of technology may draw upon

many fields of knowledge, including scientific, engineering, mathematical, linguistic, and historical knowledge, to achieve some practical result.

Technology is often a consequence of science and engineering — although technology as a human activity precedes the two fields. For example, science might study the flow of electrons in electrical conductors, by using already-existing tools and knowledge. This new-found knowledge may then be used by engineers to create new tools and machines, such as semiconductors, computers, and other forms of advanced technology. In this sense, scientists and engineers may both be considered technologists; the three fields are often considered as one for the purposes of research and reference

Eastern Caribbean

On the ECSE last week, 150 shares of SKNB traded firm at \$3.30 and 590 shares of ECFH traded at \$11.00, an increase of 4.8% on its previous closing price of \$10.50.

On Monday last week, The Government of Antigua and Barbuda successfully auctioned a ninety-one day \$17 million T Bill at a discount rate of 6.5%.

Trinidad

Losers outnumbered winners 11 to 5 after 3 days of trading on the TTSE last week. Advancers included NEL, RML and BST, while GHL & RBTT were among the decliners. Sagicor, NCB Jamaica and Guardian Holdings emerged volume leaders for the review period.

In Trinidad, headline inflation continued on a downward trend, slowing to 8% in March 2007. This is the fifth consecutive month of decline since the rate peaked at 10% in October 2006. Food prices registered a year-on-year increase of

18.8% in March 2007 compared to 19.7% in February.

Jamaica

Jamaican indices declined last week, all by less than 1%. The advance decline ratio was 18 to 10, while 7 stocks traded firm. Cable & Wireless was the most popular stock, trading over 20% of total volumes, closing down 4 cents at a price of 90 cents. Decliners included JMMB, Grace Kennedy & Supreme Ventures. FCIB & Carreras were among the advancers.

The newly constituted Scotia Group whose stock was listed on the JSE last week, lost 6.2% of its value on its first day of trading when over 22,000 shares changed ownership. Some 3.1 billion Scotia Group Jamaica shares were listed at \$23.55. Last week's listing marked the official completion of Scotiabank's Scheme of Reconstruction, following its acquisition of majority share holding in DB&G.

Barbados

The BSE indices recorded negligible upward movements as 2 stocks advanced while none declined. The two advancers were Barbados

Shipping & Sunbeach. 7 stocks traded for the week with Sagicor, Barbados Shipping & FCIB emerging volume leaders accounting for 55,000 of the 65,000 units traded.

Barbados' economy grew by an estimated 3.7% over the first three months of this year, down from the 4.1% growth over the same period in 2006. Construction, the main driver of the economy for over a year, only expanded by 5.4%, which marks a 1.1% decline from 2006.

International

On the international front, the S&P 500 rose 0.8%, the Dow average climbed 1.1% and the Nasdaq gained 0.6%. Asian stocks rebounded this week, with South Korea, Hong Kong and Australia among the markets climbing to new records. European stocks also advanced this week as takeover speculation intensified and corporate earnings beat analysts' estimates.

In commodities news, crude oil fell, closing with the biggest weekly decline in four months, on signs that U.S. supplies are adequate.
