SPECIAL DEVELOPMENT AREAS ACT, CAP. 15.29 CHOC ESTATES LTD AND JQ CHARLES LTD.

In exercise of the power conferred by section 4 of the Special Development Areas Act, Cap.15.29, the Minister responsible for finance designates Choc Estates Ltd and JQ Charles Ltd. as an approved developer to facilitate the construction of commercial or industrial building including office complexes in the Choc Estate area for a period of six months commencing from September 02nd, 2009 subject to the following conditions -

NOTICE: SEA TURTLE FISHERY

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, LANDS, FORESTRY AND FISHERIES

The Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries wishes to inform the public that the sea turtle fishery is in effect from October 01, 2009 to December 31, 2009, both days inclusive.

To ensure sustainable harvesting of this resource, all fishers and the public are required to adhere to the following conditions: .

- **Only traditional sea turtle fishermen** shall partake in the sea turtle fishery.

- The sea turtle **fishery shall extend from October 1st, 2009 to December 31st, 2009, regardless of weather conditions**, unless otherwise specified by the Chief Fisheries Officer. No authorised, traditional sea turtle fisherman shall fish for, remove from the fishery waters, or at any time have in his possession, expose for sale, sell or purchase any sea turtle from January 1st, 2010, unless otherwise specified by the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- **Only Green, Hawksbill and Loggerhead** sea turtles shall be **permitted** in the catch. **All Leatherback** sea turtles caught shall be released immediately by fishermen.
- **Only sea turtle nets** shall be used for targeting sea turtles during the above-stipulated period. **No other gear** shall be permitted for the targeting of sea turtles.
- **A maximum of three sea turtle nets** shall be **permitted per traditional sea turtle fisherman**, for the targeting of sea turtles.
- There shall be **no fishing** of sea turtles **within 100 metres of the shore**.
- There shall be **no fishing** for sea turtles **over coral reef areas**.
- Sea turtles shall be **landed whole**.
- **No products** are to be made from turtle shell or their products **for sale or export**.
- Sea turtles shall be **taken to a designated landing site**, where sea turtle data shall be collected, unless otherwise specified by the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- **No sea turtles** shall be **slaughtered or sold on beaches or in other open places**. **Only designated landing sites and fish markets** shall be used.
- All fishermen shall **permit the collection of data by Fisheries Data Collectors and or/Fisheries Officers**.
- Only sea turtles **at and above the sizes stipulated in the Fisheries Regulations No.9 of 1994**, shall be **targeted**:
 - Hawksbill sea turtles: 27.22 kg (60 pounds)
 - Green sea turtles and Loggerhead sea turtles: 34.02 kg (75 pounds)
- **No person** shall **interfere** with any **sea turtle nest or sea turtle that is nesting**.
- **No person** shall at any time, disturb, remove from the fishery waters, expose for sale, sell, purchase at any time or have in his possession any **sea turtle eggs**.
- **No sea turtle shells** shall be **sold** to locals or visitors.
- **No sea turtle shells** shall be **exported**.

- **No sea turtle meat shall be exported.**
- **No attempts shall be made to sell sea turtle meat to tourism establishments that cater primarily to visitors.**
- Each contravention of the above Conditions shall result in a **maximum fine of five thousand dollars (\$5000)** as stipulated under the Fisheries Act No. 10 of 1984 and the Fisheries Regulations No.9 of 1994.

The Department of Fisheries will be conducting monitoring activities islandwide to obtain an estimation of the landings during this harvest period and will be working along with the Royal Saint Lucia Police Force, the Customs Department and other enforcement agencies to ensure that all persons abide by the harvest conditions stipulated above.

All harvesting activities must cease after the last day of the open period. No persons are allowed to have in their possession or expose for sale any sea turtle or sea turtle products after the closure of the harvest period. Fishers and the general public are hereby urged to observe and comply with the aforementioned conditions.

THREE DAY SEA URCHIN HARVEST PERIOD
MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, LANDS, FORESTRY
AND FISHERIES

In light of the number of sea urchins observed during the Department of Fisheries' pre harvest surveys, the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries is authorizing a three day, islandwide harvest period to take place from Tuesday 29th September 2009 to Thursday 1 st October, 2009, both days inclusive.

To ensure that the sea egg populations are not over harvested, and that juveniles (young sea eggs) remain for the benefit of future harvests, all harvesters are required to adhere to the following conditions:

1. All persons must harvest only eggs that are at least 9.0cm (3.5 inches) in diameter (measured at the widest length across the body of the animal);
2. There should be no harvesting in any Marine Reserve such as the Maria Islands Nature Reserve and the reserves within SMMA and CAMMA;
3. No Scuba gear is to be used for harvesting of sea urchins.
4. All sea urchins must be brought to shore for breaking and processing (no such activities are to be carried out at sea);

5. All persons who operate as "cleaners" must bury urchin shells on a daily basis, placing them above the high tide mark and covering them with at least six inches of sand;
6. All harvesters and cleaners must make available to the Department of Fisheries any data on sizes and weights, as requested; .
7. No exportation of sea urchin is permitted without first obtaining the required export permit from the Department of Fisheries. Only export for personal consumption will be entertained (i.e., quantities of less than 10 Lbs).

Persons failing to adhere to the above conditions will be liable to a fine of up to five thousand dollars (\$5000.00), as stipulated by the Fisheries Regulations No.9 of 1994 Section 36 (a).

The Department of Fisheries will be conducting monitoring activities islandwide to obtain an estimation of the landings during this open period and will be working along with the police to ensure that all persons abide by the harvest conditions.

All harvesting activities must cease after this stated period. No persons are allowed to have in their possession or expose for sale any sea urchins after closure of the period. Harvesters and the general public are hereby urged to observe and comply with the aforementioned conditions.

UK broadband 'not fit' for future

A global study of broadband puts the UK 25th out of 66 countries in terms of the quality of its broadband networks.

The research, conducted on behalf of Cisco, set out to offer a comprehensive view of the state of global broadband.

It also found that countries such as Latvia and Bulgaria were better prepared than the UK for next-generation net applications.

Korea and Japan continue to dominate the league table, largely due to their commitment to fast networks.

In Korea, for example, the government has promised universal speeds of up to 1Gbps (gigabit per second) by 2012.

Despite not being ready for future applications, the UK was well placed to cope with today's network demands, the study found.

When it comes to technology that looks like gaining ground, Mr Rattner spotlighted 3 dimensional (3-D) TV.

"It seems like there is an announcement every week on 3-D," he told developers.

"It can be a bit misleading to look at the rankings. The important thing is whether the broadband quality of a country is good enough for today's needs and the UK falls well within this category," said Joanne Hughes, Cisco's communication manager.

She expects the UK to improve dramatically next year.

"We forecast the UK will improve because of things such as cable networks being upgraded and the Digital Britain report focusing on next generation access," she said.

The study was conducted jointly by Oxford University's Säid Business School and the University of Oviedo's Department of Applied Economics.

It found that the average global download speed globally was 4.75Mbps (megabits per second), while average upload speed was 1.3Mbps.

Future demands

Researchers worked out how fit countries were to cope with the demands of today's users based on a set of applications consumers are likely to use.

These included sharing photos, using video on Skype, watching YouTube and standard definition BBC iPlayer content.

It found that two-thirds of the 66 countries met the criteria for today's requirements.

But only nine countries, including Korea, Japan, Sweden, Latvia were ready for future demands, such as watching high definition video.

This is a big improvement on last year's study which found only Japan was ready for the future.

Researchers estimated that countries would need an average download speed of 11.25Mbps and an upload speed of 5Mbps in order to be comfortably placed for future applications.

South Africa to review Trophy failure

Cricket South Africa says it will be “brutally honest” in its analysis of why they failed to reach the semi-finals of the Champions Trophy.

The hosts bowed out after defeats to Sri Lanka and England, the latest in a series of early tournament exits.

Coach Mickey Arthur and chief executive Gerald Majola released a statement, saying: “There will be a brutally honest analysis of our early demise.

“We must ensure that failures of this nature do not happen again.”

The Proteas, who were the world’s top-ranked team in both Test and one-day cricket going into the tournament, have only once won an ICC event, the inaugural Champions Trophy in Bangladesh in 1998.

They have only once failed to reach the semi-final in five prior editions of the competition, while their five World Cup appearances have seen them reach the last four in 1992, 1999 and 2007.

South Africa were favourites to lift the World Twenty20 trophy earlier this year only to lose to Pakistan in the semi-finals, and CSA admits their recent performances have not been good enough.

The statement continued: “If mistakes have been made, then they must be acknowledged and remedied before the next World Cup.

“All credit must go to the Proteas for being ranked as the world’s top Test and ODI team.

“However, this must not overshadow the urgent need to bridge the gap between these ratings and the failure of the Proteas to reach the semi-finals of the ICC Champions Trophy on home soil as well as other major knock-out tournaments elsewhere.
