Background:

As an Article 5 country to the Montreal Protocol, Saint Lucia is committed to gradually reduce and eliminate its imports and use of ozone-depleting substances (ODS) between 1999 and the final phase-out date of January 1st 2040. Saint Lucia is also eligible for assistance from the Protocol's Multilateral Fund to comply with this requirement, including receiving assistance from bilateral donors, such as Canada, that contribute to the Fund. The National Ozone Unit (NOU), within the Sustainable Development and Environment Section of the Ministry of Physical Development and the Environment is responsible for implementing the Montreal Protocol in Saint Lucia.

Over the years, efforts to facilitate the successful reduction in the consumption and use of chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) and hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs) in Saint Lucia have included projects such as a Country Programme in 1995, Institutional Strengthening from 1997 to present, the Refrigerant Management Plan (RMP) from 1998 to 2002, and the Refrigerant Management Plan Update from 2004 to 2007. Both the RMP and RMP Update were implemented and financed by Canada, with some assistance from the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). Activities implemented under these projects included training of refrigeration technicians in good practices to reduce ODS, provision of refrigerant recovery and recycling equipment, development of comprehensive legislation to control imports of all ODS, and training of customs officers on this legislation. As a result, Saint Lucia has been able to phase out its consumption of CFCs from a baseline of 8.3 ozone-depleting potential (ODP) adjusted tonnes (ODP tonnes), to 0 ODP tonnes as of January 2010.

The Terminal Phase-Out Management Plan (TPMP) was approved under the Multilateral Fund for the implementation of the Montreal Protocol at its 52nd meeting, in July 2006, to assist the Saint Lucia in achieving the phase out of CFCs and monitoring illegal trade in CFCs. The TPMP consists of three project components which form an integrated strategy to achieve the elimination of CFCs in the only sector where these substances are used in Saint Lucia, that is to say, the refrigeration and air conditioning (RAC) sector.

Project Description:

The following provides only a brief description of the components of the TPMP. It should be noted that the procurement of Recovery and Recycling (R&R) equipment and accessories falls under component II.

Component I: Establishment of a monitoring, evaluation and reporting mechanism

Component II: Investment interventions and technicians training to achieve consumption reductions

Component III: Strengthening the enforcement and compliance framework to facilitate the smooth transition to a CFC-free economy

Component I aims to ensure the effectiveness of all the projects proposed within the TPMP through constant monitoring and periodic evaluation and reporting of the impacts of the projects, as well as through formulating recommendations on corrective measures when impacts or milestones are not met. Component III seeks to strengthen the control of ODS in Saint Lucia in order to facilitate the total phase-out of these substances. Through this sub-project, the importation of CFCs has been eliminated. Illegal trade will be prevented and the refrigeration servicing sector will become better organised to assist with the transition to a CFC-free

economy (through the establishment of the National Refrigeration and Air condition Association).

Component II: Investment interventions and technicians training to achieve phase out

Under this component, the RAC sector in Saint Lucia is to be provided with tools, equipment and training to support ODS phase out. This will be achieved through additional training of technicians, particularly on emerging issues, such as retrofitting techniques and procedures, and the use of alternative refrigerants such as hydrocarbons and the HFC-400 series and the effects of refrigerants on climate.

Under the component, the NOU has targeted approximately 80-100 technicians. The training will include good practices, recovery and recycling (R&R), retrofitting CFC-based equipment, and use of alternative refrigerants, including hydrocarbons and linkages with climate and energy efficiency. In addition, technicians who previously received some training on good practices but need to update their skills in certain areas may be selected for training as appropriate.

A key part of this component is the procurement of R&R equipment, tools and accessories. With assistance from Environment Canada (EC) and the RAC sector, a detailed list of equipment, tools and accessories has been developed for procurement. It consists mostly of R&R equipment for the domestic and mobile air conditioning (MAC) sub-sector and tools for retrofitting CFC and HCFC-based equipment. The NOU will be responsible for distributing the equipment to technicians in the country, monitoring the use of the equipment, and reporting to EC periodically on the use of the equipment. Such reports will include information on quantities of refrigerants recovered and re-used, as well as the number and type of ODS based-equipment retrofitted to alternatives.

Objectives:

The main objectives are to procure equipment and accessories to recover and recycle (R&R) refrigerants, retrofit equipment and facilitate good practices, on behalf of the Government of Saint Lucia. The list of equipment and their specifications are contained in Section 3 of this document.

Methodology:

The Purchaser is required to consult with the National Ozone Unit to procure R&R equipment and accessories that meets the needs and standards of the refrigeration and air conditioning sector.

THE ABC OF THE LAW

'ACTION'

In law, we often speak about a person taking 'action' against another person or authority.

What exactly is an 'action' in law?

An action is the form of conduct prescribed by law for the recovery of one's due or the lawful demand of one's right.

Actions are divided into criminal and civil.

Criminal actions are also called 'prosecutions'. Thus we speak of a person being prosecuted for a crime.

'BAIL'

An accused person is on 'bail' when he is released from the custody of the officers of the law and entrusted to the custody of a person known as his 'surety'. It is the responsibility of the surety to produce the accused person to answer the charge against him on every date and time on which the case is called in the court. If the surety fails to produce the accused person, any sum of monies or other properties used as security for the bail, is liable to be forfeited by the court.

'CONTRACT'

An agreement to do or to abstain from doing some act which is intended to give rise to legal relations. A contract may be written or verbal.

To be binding in law, a contract must have a legal subject matter. Thus a contract to commit a crime is an illegal contract and the court will not enforce it.

'DEFENDANT'

A person against whom an action (civil or criminal) is brought.

'EQUITABLE'

That which is fair.

The 'equitable' concept played a role in the recognition by courts of the non-monetary contribution of a woman in the home.

Apple launches new Mac mini

The compact Mac now connects more easily to HDTVs and digital cameras



Apple's updated Mac mini has HDMI interface to connect to high-def

Apple launched a new version of its lowest-priced computer, Mac mini, with an HDMI port to connect directly to high-definition TVs, and an SD slot for compatibility with most camera memory cards. It has twice the graphics performance of its predecessors, but it also has lower power usage. The new specs do come at

a cost: At \$699, its entry price is \$100 more than past models.

The new Mac mini, which is 7.7 inches square by 1.4 inches, consumes less than 10 watts of power when idle. That fact, combined with improved performance, HDMI port and SD card slot, suggests that it could be used as a home theater PC, competing with Apple's less expensive (but less capable) Apple TV.

Like earlier Mac minis, it has an integrated DVD drive. Apple is not offering a Blu-ray high-definition movie-disc drive at this time, but the iTunes service does offer high-definition movie downloads to rent or buy.

It has a Nvidia GeForce 320M graphics processor, a 2.4 gigahertz Intel Core 2 Duo processor, 320 gigabyte (GB) hard-disk and 2GB RAM. It comes with Mac's Snow Leopard operating system, and its iLife suite of photo and video-editing software.

Historical Focus

KOUDMEN

More and more, any work done is either in expectation of wage payment or is of a personal nature as everyone sees about his/her affairs. This behaviour is the opposite of the popular co-operative work attitude - the Koudmen, which has been part of St. Lucian community life for generations.

The Koudmen is about members of a community or friends lending a hand to do work. It involves someone having a piece of work to do that requires some amount of labour. He/she would organise a Koudmen for one day (usually Sunday) in which friends and helpers would come with their friends and provide free labour. He/she would supply food, drink and other refreshments to last out the day. This means that he/she saves money which would otherwise have gone into labour costs. Examples of work that were popular for the Koudmen included: house building, clearing, ploughing and sowing a piece of land and log sawing (siyè-bwa) in the forest.

Another interesting aspect of the Koudmen is the use of rhythm and music which makes the work enjoyable and some would say, easier. Particularly in the agricultural based work, one would find an accompanying group of musicians, whose sole work was to provide rhythm and song back up to the work. The main instrument was usually the tanbou/drum enhanced by other percussion sounds like a bamboo, iron or bottle being struck. The songs were usually work chants which follow the traditional folk form of call and response. The response being a standard chorus that was repeated whereas the call was improvised by a lead singer called a chantè or chantwel. There were work chants for agricultural work such as cutlassing, digging, hoeing, polishing cocoa, for quarry and stone breaking, for axing, hauling and sawing timber and for hauling and rowing canoes. There were even songs which accompanied certain domestic tasks such as scraping and grating cassava.

The Koudmen does not only benefit the individual who holds the koudmen but also has tremendous social value for all involved. It helps to enhance community spirit and encourages a sense of caring and interest in the well being of others. The individual who holds the koudmen may very well have his reputation for community spirit and generosity enhanced. There is a sense of expected reciprocity in the koudmen in that it is expected that the individual will one day be called upon to help out in another koudmen held by someone who has helped him. In this way, everybody helps and can expect to be helped one day.

Above all, the koudmen can instil a co-operative approach to work and organisation which is useful to many other aspects of life in the broader society.
