

Request for Legislative Drafter to Review Biosafety Bill, Biosafety policy and Biosafety Regulations

Background:

Saint Lucia imports most of its food from the USA. That country is well known for the strides that have been made in genetically modified foods, several of which are currently traded. Investigations into the kinds of food imported into Saint Lucia indicate that most likely genetically modified organisms (GMOs) are entering the country as currently there are no monitoring mechanisms in place. Besides food, other products such as pharmaceuticals that are genetically modified may also be entering the country. If properly regulated, GMOs may hold significant benefits for the country. However, if not GMOs can produce significant negative impacts on human health and the environment.

The Ministry of Sustainable Development, Energy, Science and Technology, in keeping with its obligations under the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety, is poised to implement Saint Lucia's National Biosafety Framework with the objective of managing the use of living and genetically modified organisms, so that their use is safe and beneficial to all. This two- year implementation project is funded by the United Nations Environment Program – Global Environment Facility (UNEP-GEF), and is being executed at the national

level by the Biodiversity Unit in the Ministry of Sustainable Development, Energy, Science and Technology.

One of the key components of this framework is enactment of Biosafety legislation which will regulate the creation, handling, transfer, import, use, transportation and export of living and genetically modified organisms. A draft Biosafety Act, Biosafety policy and Biosafety regulations have been prepared to address these objectives.

The Biosafety Project is seeking the services of a Legislative Drafter to review and revise these documents and finalize them for submission to Cabinet.

Terms of service:

The consultant shall be contracted for a period of 30 working days between July 23rd and October 7, 2013 to undertake the following assignment.

A. *Review of the regulations, policy and bill for the proposed Biosafety Act:*

Establish the threshold percentage of GM contained within a product which would necessitate labeling; based on consultations with NCC, experts, stakeholders and best practices used globally

Review the form of application and payment of fees in respect of an application for a permit under this Act

Review the form and contents of permits granted under this Act.

Identify the role of the public and relevant agencies in the monitoring and enforcement of permits under the Act

Identify procedures to be followed in suspending and revoking permits (suspension, revocation of and disqualification from holding a permit)

Specify quarantine provisions for GMOs and LMOs introduced in the country without proper permits/licenses or documentation

Define the term "operator" in the context of use and control of GMO or LMO

Outline the process of assessing damages to biological resources and human health resulting from unintentional release or transboundary movements of GMO/LMO and deciding on emergency response measures

Include provisions in Biosafety regulations to assign liability and determine appropriate actions where there is damage to biological resources resulting from unintentional transboundary movement of LMO.

Include provisions which make the assessment of risk and detection of GM products cost neutral to the country of import

Ensure that the requirement to include public participation

and feedback in decision making process are mandated in the bill

Ensure that the National Biosafety policy in keeping with national development goals takes into consideration relevant emerging policies including CSME

B. Present to Project Coordinator, National Biosafety Coordinating Committee and Relevant Stakeholders

The first draft of the Bill, Policy and Regulations should be presented to the Project Coordinator by August 16, 2013 for review and selection of an appropriate date for convening of a national consultation.

Upon conclusion of the review and updating of the legislation, the consultant shall present the final bill to the NCC and other stakeholders at a national consultation, explaining any technical areas and advising on the procedures and process to be followed regarding the preparation, adoption and revision of policies, strategies and plans prepared under this bill, The consultant will also note recommendations, modifications and inputs from stakeholders

The final draft of the legislature, with incorporated inputs from the NCC and national consultation, should be presented to the Project Coordinator by September 23, 2013.

C. Submission of Biosafety Bill to Ministry of Legal Affairs, Home Affairs and National Security

The finalized version of the Bill will be submitted to the Drafting Department of the Ministry of Legal Affairs, Home Affairs and National Security. This should be completed by October 5, 2013.

The consultant is to cooperate with the drafting officer to review the Bill and prepare it for submission to Parliament

The consultant is to be present when the Bill is being presented to the House of Parliament to answer questions and make any necessary clarifications

Qualifications:

The successful candidate will have a degree in law/environmental law or related field with specific professional work experience in legislative drafting; track record of involvement in similar exercises with at least five (5) years working experience using participatory and consultative processes. Familiarity with MEAs and trade agreements is a plus.

Payment:

Upon timely and satisfactory completion of the assignment, provided that the guidelines have been adhered to and objectives are met, the consultant will be paid within two weeks of the submission of the finalized approved Biosafety Bill to the Ministry of Legal Affairs, Home Affairs and National Security. Unjustifiable delays in the completion of the assignment will be unacceptable.

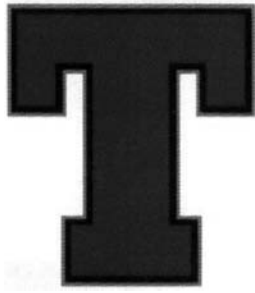
