POST OF DISTRICT EDUCATION OFFICER

Job Title:

District Education Officer

Department: District IV

Classification: Grade 17

Reports to: Chief Education Officer

Supervises:

Staff in the District Office
and Principals of District IV

RELATIONSHIPS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Liaises with the Chief Education Officer, Permanent Secretary, Deputy Permanent Secretary, Deputy Chief Education Officers – Instruction and Planning, principals, teachers, students, representatives of denominational schools, Sir Arthur Lewis Community College, community groups and organizations, other Government Ministries and Donor Agencies.

Works in collaboration with the Chief Education Officer to ensure that schools are administered in a proper and efficient manner.

Supervises and supports schools within the District and serves as liaison between the Ministry of Education and schools.

DUTIES AND TASKS:

Manages the District Education Office through monitoring and

supervision of staff to ensure that the objectives of the District are met.

Provides general supervision of instruction at schools by visiting each school at least twice per term to ensure effective delivery of the programme of instruction.

Intervenes on matters which may impact negatively on instruction or the general operation of the school by providing advice and guidance to ensure effective delivery of instruction in schools.

Advises principals on matters of school administration and organization by maintaining appropriate dialogue and providing the relevant support needed to ensure quality in the school system.

Informs the Chief Education Officer of school issues and makes recommendations for action so that schools may operate more effectively. 3.6 Assists schools in obtaining the necessary curricula, curriculum materials and other documents essential to the planning and effective delivery of instruction.

Initiates, organizes and assists with the development and delivery of appropriate in-service and orientation training programmes for principals and staff to help strengthen the capacities to effectively manage instruction at schools.

Develops, implements and evaluates a District Improvement Plan by collaborating with relevant stakeholders to ascertain that the District has a strategic focus that will assist in achieving the Ministry of Education's goals.

Keeps a log of school visits, termly reports and annual progress reports on the officer's programme of activities and submits to the Chief Education Officer for sound decision making.

Assists principals in formulating and evaluating annual performance objectives and plans by providing guidance and making the necessary

recommendations for school development and improvement.

Co-ordinates annual performance reviews of schools within the District through dialogue with principals and staff and submits reports to the Chief Education Officer for informed decision making.

Works closely with other team members to prepare annual budget for the District by incorporating the yearly activities in order to adopt a clear understanding of what the District intends to achieve.

Advises the Ministry on resources and other material needs of schools to ensure that all schools have the required resources that will enhance the teaching/learning process resulting in greater student achievement.

Harnesses support from the community for the further development of the school.

Performs any other related duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Chief Education Officer and the Permanent Secretary.

CONDITIONS:

Accommodation provided in a general administrative office.

The processes of the Unit will be carried out on the basis of team work. The officer will be expected to be an active team member who understands all the processes of the Unit.

The officer will be required to maintain a high level of integrity, confidentiality, honesty and trust at all times.

The officer will be required to maintain a motor vehicle to function in a scheduled travelling post and is expected to be in the field.

The officer will receive a travelling allowance in accordance with approved rates established by the Government of Saint Lucia.

Early Childhood Education Unit

Classification: Grade 17

Reports to: Chief Education Officer

Supervises:

All operations within the Early Childhood Sector

RELATIONSHIPS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Networks with local, regional and international agencies and other actors who can contribute to the development of the Early Childhood Sector by providing direction and focus to the Sector.

Advises the Chief Education Officer on strategies and actions that will enhance the development of the Early Childhood Sector in St. Lucia.

Develops, directs and administers plans and programmes to implement the St. Lucia Early Childhood Policy.

DUTIES AND TASKS:

Manages the daily operations of the Early Childhood Services Unit by maintaining constant dialogue with staff to ensure efficiency and effectiveness.

Analyses the implication of policy and legislative initiatives and assesses their impact on programme and service delivery through discussions and documentation thus enabling sound decisions.

Co-ordinates the activities of different stakeholders within the St. Lucia Early Childhood Sector – parents, providers, practitioners and staff, through direct and indirect communication to ensure successful outcomes.

Prepares the Unit’s annual budget, work plans and programmes by incorporating the yearly activities in order to adopt a clear understanding of what the Unit intends to achieve.

Identifies and facilitates the development of projects for the

advancement of the Early Childhood Sector through direct and indirect communication, so as to achieve the medium and long term goals of the Unit.

Conducts periodic reviews and submits quarterly evaluation reports to the Chief Education Officer through monitoring and observing the performance of staff and the use of available technology.

Maintains an efficient, comprehensive record-keeping system that allows for appropriate management of the Early Childhood Sector through all communication tools available.

Develops plans and programmes for the total integration of existing Early Childhood Services in accordance with the national objectives of the St. Lucia Early Childhood Policy through dialogue, discussion and documentation that would ensure efficiency in service provision and programming.

Prepares project proposals for the development and enhancement of the Early Childhood Sector through the use of relevant communication tools in order to ensure efficient service delivery.

Ensures that centres utilize the technology and necessary curricula essential to service provision and quality programming.

Assists with the delivery of professional development/training activities through direct and indirect supervision to ensure efficiency and effectiveness.

Performs any other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Chief Education Officer and the Permanent Secretary.

CONDITIONS:

Accommodation is provided in a general Administrative Office.

The officer is required to maintain a motor vehicle to function in a scheduled travelling post. Basic travelling and mileage allowances will

be paid in accordance with approved rates.

Salary is in accordance with the terms stipulated by the Government in the Estimates/Collective Agreement and is liable to taxation in accordance with the Income Tax Ordinance by the National Insurance Corporation.

Institutional support is provided through appropriate Civil Service and Teaching Service Regulations, Statutory Instrument and Departmental Guidelines.

Opportunities exist for personal development and career advancement through established orientation and in-service training (workshops, seminars, orientation courses).

Quarters, free medical attention and medicine will not be provided.

EVALUATION METHOD:

Work performance will be evaluated on the basis of:

Effective implementation of the Early Childhood Policy as per the provisions of the agreed upon action;

Efficient service delivery in the Sector that meets or exceeds the minimum standards that have been mandated by the Government;

Capability to develop quality programmes and facilitate the development of projects that will advance the Early Childhood Sector;

Effective demonstration of supervisory and management capabilities;

Compliance with Departmental and Ministry’s Guidelines and Standard Operating Procedures;

Effective implementation of duties, responsibilities and assignments as defined in the Job Description.

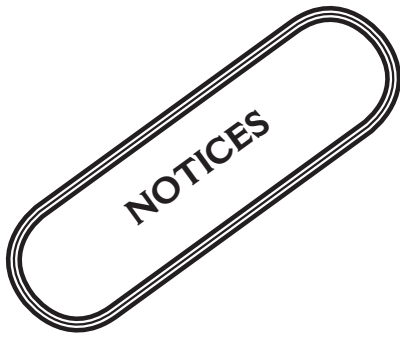

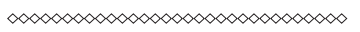
Component 2: Transaction and regulatory support. The component will support the GoSL in designing, structuring and negotiating an equitable agreement with a potential qualified geothermal developer; and will ensure a fair allocation of potential risks. It will also help facilitate initial off-take arrangements with the power company that is essential for moving forward with potential investments. The work will also help ensure that the legal and regulatory framework provides an adequate investment climate for a potential power project; and it will lead to the inclusion of geothermal as a part of LUCELEC's formal expansion plans, providing the certainty for investing in exploration drilling.

The project is expected to be completed by January 31, 2017.

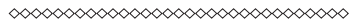

OPEN LOBSTER FISHERY

THE Ministry of Agriculture, Food Production, Fisheries, Co-operatives and Rural Development informs the general public that the lobster fishery is **OPEN** from **August 2, 2014 to February 28, 2015**, both days inclusive.

When the lobster fishery is open, lobsters may be obtained, fished for, sold and purchased; however, the following regulations are in effect in accordance with the Fisheries Regulations Chapter 7,15 of the Revised Laws of Saint Lucia 2008:

No person shall harm, give, receive from anyone, or at any time have in his possession, expose for sale, sell or purchase:

- (a) any lobster that is undersized;
- (b) any lobster carrying egg; and
- (c) any lobster which is moulting.

No person shall:

(d) remove the eggs from a lobster, or have in his possession, or sell, or purchase a lobster from which the eggs have been removed;

(e) spear, hook or attempt to spear a lobster;

(f) sell any lobster that has been speared, hooked, or otherwise impaled, and

(g) fish for, remove from the fishery waters, give, or at any time have in his possession, expose for sale, sell or purchase any lobster between [March 1 2014 to August 1 2014, both days inclusive, as was stated by the Minister by notice published in the Gazette and in a newspaper which is printed or circulated in the State] *

In this Regulation:

(a) "lobster" includes the whole or any part of any lobster;

(b) "undersized" means in relation to lobsters-

(i) less than 9.5 centimetres (3.75 ins.) in carapace length measured from the ridge at the base of the horns to the end of the carapace (back shell); or

(ii) if the tail has been removed, a tail weight of less than 340 grammes (12 ounces)

Contravention of each of these Regulations is subject to a maximum fine of **EC\$5000.00 for each offence.**

The Department seeks the cooperation of all persons and encourages members of the public to report to the marine police, district police stations or the Department of Fisheries, any person or establishment that is found contravening the **REGULATIONS FOR THE LOBSTER FISHERY.**

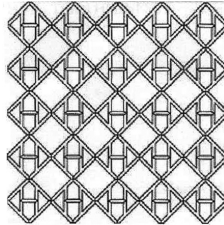

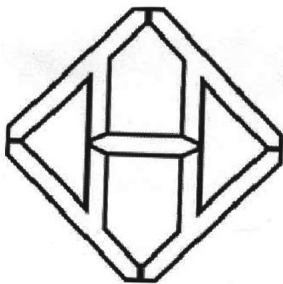
