5. Coordinates regional policy initiatives aimed at enhancing growth such as the Caribbean Growth Forum.
6. Monitors the Millennium Development Goals and new Sustainable Development Goals.

7. Represents the Department of Planning on inter-ministerial committees which aim to improve policy coordination and enhance sectoral outcomes. These include the Doing Business Task Force, Tourism Competitiveness Strategy Implementation Committee, Trade Facilitation Task Force and other Committees required for policy formulation implementation.
8. Reviews reports from consultants on key issues affecting the economy and provide input on sector related policy and strategic documents emanating from the work of the Office on the National Authorizing Office, the Project Coordination Unit, line agencies and the donor community.
9. Undertakes economic research and analysis in support of project development, public sector policy and strategy formulation.
10. Prepares detailed departmental/unit progress reports on a quarterly basis to be submitted no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of the quarter.

3. Conducts inspections of staff, facilities, equipment, and records.
4. Plans, monitors and evaluates the Centre to ensure goals and objectives are met, personnel are productively utilized, adequate work quality standards are maintained and departmental policies and procedures are followed.
5. Reviews and evaluates operational performance of the Centre and recommends appropriate corrective actions.
6. Provides instruction to assigned personnel on methods, procedures, rules and regulations.
7. Prepares statistical and budget information and prepares reports of expenditures, activities performed and other related information.
8. Formulates budget recommendations, providing supporting documentation.
9. Determines best course of action in the completion of assignments in assigned area including setting priorities.

The Ministry of Agriculture, Food Production, Fisheries, Co-operatives and Rural Development informs the general public that the **Sea Urchin Fishery opens for 7 days from October 19-25th, 2015**, both days inclusive. And will remain **closed from October 26th, 2015** until further notice from the Department of Fisheries.

During the open period sea urchin fishers are urged to follow the harvest conditions that specify **a minimum size limit of 9cm** to ensure the sea urchin population is sustainably managed; and all harvesting activities must cease at midnight on Sunday October 25th, 2015.

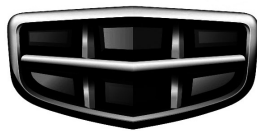
