POST OF DEPUTY DIRECTOR SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION

RELATIONSHIPS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Manages and coordinates social research initiatives and data analyses which inform evidence-based public policy formulation and programming in the Research and Development Unit.
2. Directs the efforts of the agency in developing its capacity for evidence-based programming and policy formulation.
3. Required to supervise Research Officers I and II.

DUTIES AND TASKS

1. Manages and oversees the smooth running of the Research and Development Unit of the Ministry of Social Transformation, Local Government and Community Empowerment.
2. Coordinates the efforts of the Research and Development Unit so as to produce in a timely fashion, reports on the social sectors.
3. Takes lead responsibility in evaluating new policy initiatives, from macroeconomic and social perspectives.
4. Acts as Chief Technical Officer of the Ministry of Social Transformation, Local Government and Community Empowerment.
5. Provides technical support to the Ministry of Social Transformation, Local Government and Community Empowerment, as well as the Government of Saint Lucia, in meeting macro social policy obligations.
6. Facilitates development cooperation between the Government of Saint Lucia and international development partners, especially on social and economic development.
7. Prepares memoranda to Cabinet on policy initiatives in respect of the social sectors and on matters relating to general macroeconomic and social policy.
8. Spearheads and oversees the conduct of research on the social sectors and on matters of a more general sociological and socio-economic nature.
9. Participates in collaborative research efforts.

10. Works in close collaboration with the Department of Statistics and the Community Services Unit for collection and analysis of both qualitative and quantitative data.
11. Assumes lead responsibility for facilitating the Ministry's consumption of relevant research outputs from various sources, including academia, independent researchers and other Government departments.
12. Leads and coordinates the implementation of Country Poverty Assessments.
13. Represents the Ministry on committees, working groups and special delegations which may be established from time to time.
14. Prepares detailed monthly work progress reports.

**POST OF FISHERIES BIOLOGIST II, I
RELATIONSHIPS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. Monitors and analyses the status of fisheries and aquatic resources and provides the information to resource users and decision makers to determine policies and regulations for sustainable fisheries management.
2. Provides technical advice and coordinates projects and activities to reduce and manage the impacts of resource users and developers on fisheries resources.

DUTIES AND TASKS

PRIMARY

1. Conducts surveys on marine habitats and biophysical properties of marine water using various field techniques and authors reports to provide information on status of the marine environment.
2. Collates and prepares reports using primary/secondary data and information on fisheries resource status to inform decisions and policy direction on fisheries development and management initiatives in Saint Lucia.
3. Assists in the effective coordination of the collection and analysis of fisheries-related data by sourcing funding for data collection, providing technical advice on methodology, verifying data and information to aid in fisheries stock assessment and accuracy of data and information.
4. Represents the Department of Fisheries and the Government of Saint Lucia at national, regional and international meetings, committees, workshops and conferences by delivering information on the fisheries sector, participating in assessing the status fisheries and the marine environment and providing guidance on country position on various proposals based assessments.
5. Develops, coordinates and implements fisheries and environmental education activities to increase knowledge, influence attitudes and provide skills to members of the public and fishers on the fisheries regulations, its scientific basis, fisheries-related and environmental issues and the impacts it may have on the fisheries sector.
6. Assists in providing technical advice on the impacts of development projects and recommendations for alternative design to developers and the Development Control Authority in an effort to reduce the impact of development on the fisheries sector.
7. Leads fisheries-related projects by planning, implementing and evaluating these projects in collaboration with staff and programs to contribute to integrated, interdisciplinary program execution.

SECONDARY

8. Provides technical advice on water-based tourism activities requiring licences to operate from the Department of Fisheries to assist in the management of coral reefs.
9. Provides technical advice on sport-fishing, recreational and commercial fishing activities applying an ecosystem approach to fisheries management to assist in the effective management of fisheries stocks.
10. Participates in marine pollution contingency planning activities to assist in the integrated management of marine pollution.
11. Participates in integrated coastal zone management activities to assist in providing feedback and advice towards the reduction of poor coastal practices.
12. Prepares periodic reports and special reports on ongoing programmes and projects for Supervisor.
13. Provides information on work planned, budget and expenditure for consideration in the annual estimates and reports on expenditure and the work programme of the Department of Fisheries.

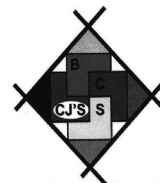
