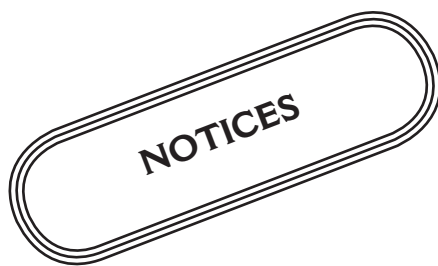

THE Government of Saint Lucia has received financing in the amount of sixty eight million United States dollars from the International Development Association (World Bank) towards the cost of the Disaster Vulnerability Reduction Project, and intends to apply part of the proceeds to hire a Social Specialist.

The Department of Planning and National Development now invites eligible individual consultants

to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Individual Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services; (Curriculum Vitae, description of similar assignments, experience in similar conditions, clients' references etc).

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the procedures for **Selection of Individual Consultants method** set out in the World Bank's Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants by World Bank Borrowers (2011). The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to paragraph 1.9 of the World Bank's *Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits & Grants by World Bank Borrowers* (2011) (“Consultant Guidelines”), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

SERVICES REQUIRED

Objectives of the Assignment

The purpose of this consultancy is to undertake the screening of works under Components 1 and 3, development and implementation of resettlement action plans during project implementation to ensure compliance with the World Bank's Social Safeguard Policy on Involuntary Resettlement (OP 4.12) and the Laws of Saint Lucia, as described in the Resettlement Policy Framework and Social Assessment Framework developed during project preparation. The consultancy is also to ensure that other broader social impacts are identified and mitigated as necessary.

SPECIFIC DUTIES AND OUTPUTS

During the preparation of sub-projects, proposed activities must be screened, scoped, and assessed, by the social specialist, for possible acquisition of land (both temporary and permanent) or impacts on

assets/access to assets including real property and livelihoods (as per OP/BP 4.12) as well as for the identification of broader social impacts of the projects. Once impacts are identified and determined the social specialist will be responsible for the development, implementation and documentation of mitigation measures as per the RPF.

The consultant is expected to implement, and report upon, the activities described in the RPF. Specifically, the duties of the consultant will include but is not limited to the following:

- Screen and scope (examine and evaluate) all activities proposed by individual subprojects to evaluate and assess the potential social risks or impacts and to determine, document and implement required mitigation measures.

- Screen and scope proposed projects for land acquisition, displacement of livelihoods (as per OP/BP 4.12).

- Develop, and coordinate the development of, sub-project Resettlement Plans (RAP's) for submission and clearance by the Bank, prior to sub-project financing.

- Coordinate the implementation of the RAP's and ensure due diligence.

DURATION

The Consultancy is expected to be awarded for a period of duration of one year in the first instance and is renewable annually as the DVRP project continues through its project cycle. The Contract will be on a retainership and the term of the Contract will be agreed upon at the engagement. It is anticipated the level of effort and time involved in fulfilling the duties and responsibilities of the Consultancy will be on the order of half-time or 26 weeks per year, depending on the level of project activity. The minimum number of

working days per assignment in any period may be sixty working days.

QUALIFICATIONS

Academic

- A minimum of a Bachelor's degree in social sciences (geography, anthropology, sociology, economics, law) or related discipline. A Master's Degree would be an asset.

Experience

- Demonstrated experience of a minimum of 5 years in the field of social development, project planning and project implementation.

- Qualitative research skills and experience in community consultation

- Knowledge of World Bank Social Safeguards policies would be an asset.

- Knowledge of public service operations in Saint Lucia or similar environment.

OPEN LOBSTER FISHERY

THE Ministry of Agriculture, Food Production, Fisheries, Co-operatives and Rural Development informs the general public that the lobster fishery is **OPEN from August 2, 2015 to February 29, 2016** both days inclusive.

When the lobster fishery is open, lobsters may be obtained, fished for, sold and purchased; however, the following regulations are in effect in accordance with the Fisheries Regulations Chapter 7.15

of the Revised Laws of Saint Lucia 2008:

No person shall harm, give, receive from anyone, or at any time have in his possession, expose for sale, sell or purchase:

- (a) any lobster that is undersized;
- (b) any lobster carrying egg; and
- (c) any lobster which is moulting.

No person shall:

(d) remove the eggs from a lobster, or have in his possession, or sell, or purchase a lobster from which the eggs have been removed.

(i) less than 9.5 centimeters (3.75 ins.) in carapace length measured from the ridge at the base of the horns to the end of the carapace (back shell); or

(ii) if the tail has been removed, a tail weight of less than 340 grammes (12 ounces)

Contravention of each of these Regulations is subject to a maximum fine of **EC\$5000.00 for each offence.**
