POST OF ASSISTANT CHIEF FORESTRY OFFICER

RELATIONSHIPS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Works under the general supervision of the Deputy Chief Forestry Officer.

CARIBBEAN DISASTER RISK FINANCING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (TA) PROGRAM SOCIAL, URBAN, RURAL AND RESILIENCE GLOBAL PRACTICE (GSURR)

BACKGROUND AND GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Caribbean countries are exposed to high levels of risk from meteorological and geophysical hazards, which have significant negative impacts on their economic and fiscal stability. These natural hazards are being exacerbated by the adverse impacts of climate change - intensifying hazard patterns and increasing stress on water availability, coastal investments and livelihoods. Based on the Climate Risk Index published by Germanwatch, the estimated annual average losses in the Caribbean region between 1993 and 2012 are US\$2.9 billion. The high costs of recovery and reconstruction have resulted in increased debt, unsustainable budgetary deficits and unreliable funding streams for many countries in the Caribbean. Absence of macroeconomic stability makes it harder for Caribbean countries to implement poverty reduction policies.

The proposed technical assistance program will be undertaken through Social, Urban, Rural, and Resilience Global Practice (GSURR) in collaboration with the World Bank (WB) Disaster Risk Financing and Insurance (DRFI) Program (GFMDR) and jointly with the Ministries of Finance (MoF) in Belize, Grenada, Jamaica and Saint Lucia and would support the understanding and quantification of sovereign contingent liabilities to natural disasters and the development of an integrated disaster risk financing framework for the countries, in order to support them in improving their financial resilience. This work will be undertaken under the umbrella of the WB supported Comprehensive Debt Framework (CDF) for the Caribbean. The proposed program will be anchored in and will benefit from the ongoing dialogue under WB Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Adaptation projects in Belize, Grenada, Jamaica and Saint Lucia. The program will be implemented in collaboration with Caribbean Catastrophe Risk Insurance Facility (CCRIF) Technical Assistance Program and will also benefit from current risk financing initiatives in the Pacific region and Indian Ocean Islands (ongoing Pacific and Indian Ocean Catastrophe Risk Assessment and Financing Programs financed by ACP-EU GFDRR

Program). The program will be developed in different national projects.

OVERVIEW

The Short-Term Consultant (Consultant) will join the GSURR to support the implementation of the Caribbean Disaster Risk Financing TA Program with special focus in Saint Lucia. The Consultant will collect, analyze, validate and catalogue information available on historical losses and expenditures from natural disasters in Saint Lucia from Post Disaster Needs Assessments (PDNA) and/or Damage and Loss Assessments (DALA), National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO) databases, other local source of information, and budgetary information on emergency response, rehabilitation and reconstruction. The information collected will inform the process of quantifying the Government of Saint Lucia's contingent liabilities.

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES FOR THE CONSULTANT

Based on an understanding of available information in Saint Lucia, the consultant will need to undertake the following activities:

Consultant Activity: Build a comprehensive and accurate catalogue of natural disaster losses and expenditures due to natural disasters in Saint Lucia including data on geographical event footprints. This catalogue should include all natural events like storms, hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, landslides among others. Losses should be in original XCD and equivalent USD (2014).

Mandatory data per event:

Each event in the catalogue must include the following information

- a. Disaster Type
- b. Disaster Name if applicable
- c. Disaster Year
- d. Disaster Month and Days
- e. Name of district/city affected
- f. Area affected (sq. km)
- g. Magnitude of Disaster
- h. Persons Affected

For each disaster event the catalogue should also include a breakdown of losses by sector:

- a. Tourism
- b. Commerce
- c. Housing
- d. Transportation Infrastructure
- e. Agriculture
- f. Health
- g. Education

- h. Electricity
- i. Water
- j. Telecom
- k. Total Losses

For each disaster event the catalogue should also include expenditures incurred by the government on disaster response and recovery, as available. For this an analysis of the national budget and estimates of national expenditures and revenue is required. This analysis will include actual expenditures by NEMO and any related sector ministry. Financial data is most helpful if broken down by source:

- a. Pre-existing national contingency fund
- b. Pre-existing regional or international contingency fund
- c. Re-allocation from existing non-disaster line-item
- d. International/multi-lateral ad hoc disaster aid.

Optional Data per event is listed in the attached template, and should be filled in as completely as possible.

The project team has already identified sources available publicly (DesInventar, EM-DAT, ECLAC). The Consultant will be required to coordinate with relevant line ministries, NEMO, local data repositories, or regional and community organizations for data beyond what is publicly available and has been already identified by the team in the preliminary draft (attached).

The tasks above are based on *current understanding of data availability. These tasks may be modified depending on data found through implementation of the tasks.*

EXPECTED OUTPUTS

The outputs expected from the Consultant are:

- A structured, fully documented catalogue of disaster losses and expenditures from natural disasters in Saint Lucia including associated event description. See attached table for guidance
- Accompanying note detailing data collection methodology and sources used in the compilation of the catalogue of historical disaster losses and expenditures.

All outputs are required in English and to be prepared using Excel or any compatible software. The consultant will be expected to use his/her own laptop computer.

TIMETABLE

The assignment will not exceed 10 days and will begin on or around October 5, 2015 and end by October 23, 2015.

Travel within country will be required and reasonable travel expenses incurred will be reimbursed subject to production of receipts and World Bank guidelines.
