 COMMUNICATION REPORT*

1. BACKGROUND

THE Government of Saint Lucia (GOSL), as signatory to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), is legally required to periodically prepare and submit National Communication (NC) reports to the UNFCCC Conference of Parties (COP). The primary objective of this document is to enable countries to report on work undertaken and planned, in

response to the adverse impacts of climate change. This enables the COP to monitor national progress towards the implementation of the UNFCCC.

Since becoming a signatory, GOSL has submitted its Initial National Communication (INC) and its Second National Communication (SNC) in November 2002 and April 2012 respectively. The preparation of the Third National Communication (Third NATCOM) was initiated in August of 2013.

The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), through its Umbrella Programme, will function as the implementing agency. At the national level, the Department of Sustainable Development, Ministry of Education, Innovation Gender Relations and Sustainable Development, (through the Sustainable Development and Environment Division (SDED)), is the executing agency on behalf of the GOSL.

The final aspects of implementation under the Third NATCOM are to complete the Constraints, Gaps, Financial and Technical Assistance Needs for Saint Lucia and to compile a synthesized document for submission to the UNFCCC. These two activities are being combined in a single consultancy. The report on Constraints, Gaps, Financial and Technical Assistance Needs for Saint Lucia seeks to 'identify needs to update information provided in the National Communication including relevant initiatives that may have taken place after the finalization of the previous National Communication components'. The synthesis report is a summary document of all the six components of Saint Lucia's Third NATCOM.

2. OBJECTIVES

- A. To produce a report providing information on the Constraints, Gaps, Financial and Technical Assistance Needs for Saint Lucia;
- B. To produce a Third NATCOM Synthesis document for Saint Lucia for onward submission to the UNFCCC.
- C. To produce a summary for policymakers of Saint Lucia's Third NATCOM.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES

CONSTRAINTS, GAPS & RELATED FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL AND CAPACITY NEEDS & SYTHESIS THIRD NATIONAL COMMUNICATION REPORT

Task 1: Conduct an inception meeting and prepare a work plan for the assignment:

- a. Review and discuss the process of conducting the assignment;

- b. Determine roles and responsibilities;
- c. Identify preliminary background information related to the assignment, including procedure and arrangement to be adopted in the compilation of data and information;
- d. Detail a schedule of meeting and consultations;
- e. Finalize an inception report, work plan with timelines.

Task 2. Compile a representative description of Saint Lucia's Constraints, Gaps and related Technical & Financial Needs:

 - a) Identify activities conducted, towards overcoming Gaps and Constraints in the INC, SNC process and the Stocktaking and Stakeholder consultations under the Third NATCOM.
 - b) Identify ways in which data collection sensitization and capacity needs in data management can be increased.
 - c) Identify barriers to increasing data management capacity and sensitisation.
 - d) Identify financial, technical support received from national and other sources.
 - e) Assess the impact of this support on the removal of constraints & gaps in the INC, SNC & Third NATCOM.
- B. Examine the financial resources needed by key agencies to execute their mandate.
 - a) Highlight the limitations posed by lack of adequate finance in carrying out their mandate.
 - b) Identify sources of funding towards enhancing financial, technical capacity needs requirements to overcome constraints and gaps.
- C. Examine the barriers to mainstreaming climate change mitigation and adaptation measures in national plans and programmes.
 - a) Identify barriers and country specific technology needs in the implementation of adaptation measures.
 - b) Examine the adequacy of technical personnel involved in climate change planning and implementation.

- c) Assess the awareness and response of climate change at national level.
- d) Assess limitations in capacity to address issues related to the impact of climate change on livelihoods and vulnerable groups in society.

Task 3. Presentation of Findings on Saint Lucia's Constraints, Gaps and related Technical & Financial Needs:

- A. Compile draft report.
- B. Present initial findings to National Climate Change Committee and other Stakeholders to be agreed upon with the Department of Sustainable Development.
- C. Amend report based on recommendations received from key stakeholders
- D. Present final report to the Department of Sustainable Development.

SYNTHESIS THIRD NATIONAL COMMUNICATION REPORT & SUMMARY FOR POLICYMAKERS

Task 4. Develop a report to be submitted as Saint Lucia's Third National Communication to the UNFCCC along with an accompanying summary for policymakers:

The Consultant is required to;

- a. Review the reports on the Third NATCOM thematic components namely, National Circumstance; Greenhouse Gas Inventory; Programmes containing measures to facilitate adequate adaptation to Climate Change; Programmes containing measures to facilitate adequate mitigation to Climate Change; Other Relevant Information considered relevant to the achievement of the objectives of the convention and; Constraints and gaps and related financial, technical and capacity needs.
- b. Extract and summarize the most relevant information from the said comprehensive reports as per the requirements of the Guidelines for the Preparation of National Communications published by the UNFCCC.
- c. Incorporate information into a synthesized document and submit the final document as Saint Lucia's Third NATCOM.
- d. Produce a summary for policymakers for Saint Lucia's Third NATCOM.
- e. Submit draft synthesis document and summary for policymakers to Department of Sustainable Development for review.
- f. Amend draft report based on findings with a view to finalizing for approval.

4. DELIVERABLES

The consultant shall deliver the following:

- a. An Inception Report, inclusive of the proposed methodology to yield the requisite information as outlined in the Scope of Work and a detailed work-plan with timelines within one (1) week of contract signature.
- b. A draft report on the Constraints and Gaps and related financial, technical and capacity needs within four (4) weeks of contract signature.
- c. A final report on Constraints and Gaps and related financial, technical and capacity needs within six (6) weeks of contract signature.
- d. A draft Synthesis report and draft summary for policymakers within nine (9) weeks of contract signature.
- e. A final Synthesis report and final summary for policymakers within (12) weeks of contract signature.

5. QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE & COMPETENCIES

The consultant is expected to possess the following;

Qualifications:

- a. Master's degree in one of the following, or related, fields: Environmental Management Studies, Climate Change or Developmental Economics.

Experience:

- a. At least five (5) years' working experience in Climate Change or Environmental Management Studies in Saint Lucia or in the Caribbean Region.
- b. Previous experience in the preparation of National Communications
- c. Former experience in compiling National Communication Synthesis Document would be an asset.

Competencies

- a. Be able to demonstrate expert knowledge of relevant processes particularly in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and the UNFCCC Convention process.
- b. Demonstrate the capability to apply expert knowledge for the execution of the required scope of work.

THE Water and Sewerage Company Inc. (WASCO) has received financing from the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) towards the cost of the rehabilitation works on the John Compton Dam (JCD) and intends to apply a portion of the proceeds of this financing to eligible payments under this contract. Payment by CDB will be made only at the request of the WASCO and upon approval by CDB, and will be subject, in all respects, to the terms and conditions of the Financing Agreement. The Financing Agreement prohibits withdrawal from the financing account for the purpose of any payment to persons or entities, or for any import of goods, if such payment or import, to the knowledge of CDB, is prohibited by a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. No party other than WASCO shall derive any rights from the Financing

Agreement or have any claim to the proceeds of the Financing.

The Project is being implemented by WASCO. WASCO has contracted Consultants who will assist the Company with delivering the Project. The Consultants have prepared conceptual designs and contract documentation and will assist in tender administration and evaluation and supervise Project activities.

The John Compton Dam (JCD) was constructed in the 1990s along the Roseau River near the village of Millet in central Saint Lucia. The reservoir water storage capacity has been compromised by sedimentation, with a corresponding effect on the reliability of water supply on the island. Rehabilitation works are therefore required.

WASCO now invites sealed bids from eligible bidders for the rehabilitation works for the John Compton Dam (JCD). The works include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Implement a dredging operation to remove sediment from the reservoir
2. Develop a nearby sediment disposal area (SDA) downstream of the dam.

The works will include installation of dredging equipment, a pipeline to the SDA, construction of the sediment containment dyke and associated water decant system plus other ancillary works.

The limits of the work will include mobilization, delivery and installation of the equipment, construction of the facilities, commissioning of the dredge system, operation of the dredge in the first dredge season, and training of operating staff.

Consideration will be limited to firms or joint ventures of firms, which are legally incorporated or otherwise organised in, and have their principal place of business in an eligible country and are either:

- (a) more than 50% beneficially owned by a citizen or citizens and/or a bona fide resident or residents of an eligible country, or by a body corporate or bodies corporate meeting these requirements; or
- (b) owned or controlled by the Government of an eligible country provided that it is legally and financially autonomous and operated under the commercial law of an eligible country and otherwise meets the eligibility requirements of the CDB Guidelines for Procurement (2006).

All countries are eligible for this opportunity.

Eligible bidders will be required to submit full qualification information with their bids establishing

their eligibility to bid and qualification to perform the contract if the bid is accepted. Tender and qualification information are to be submitted in the English Language on the prescribed forms inserted in the Bid Documents. Submissions that do not provide the information required, or do not demonstrate the prospective contractor's ability to perform satisfactorily, will not qualify and will not be considered for further evaluation.

Qualification requirements include, inter alia:

- (a) an average annual turnover (defined as certified payments received for works in progress or completed) within the last 5 years of at least twelve million eight hundred thousand United States dollars (USD \$12,800,000.00);
- (b) a demonstrable cash flow (including access to credit) of two million United States dollars (USD 2,000,000); and
- (c) experience as prime contractor in the construction of at least two assignments of a nature, scope and complexity comparable to the proposed project activity within the last 6 years (to comply with this requirement, works quoted should be at least 80 percent complete).
