- **DNS/IEC 60335 – 2- 35: 2012 Household and similar electrical appliances – Safety – Part 2- 35: Particular requirements for instantaneous water heaters**

Scope

This standard sets the requirements for the safety of electric instantaneous water heaters for household and similar purposes and intended for heating water below boiling temperature, their rated voltage being not more than 250 V for single-phase appliances and 480 V for other appliances. Instantaneous water heaters incorporating bare heating elements are within the scope of this standard. Appliances not intended for normal household use but that nevertheless may be a source of danger to the public, such as appliances intended to be used by laymen in shops, in light industry and on farms, are within the scope of this standard. As far as is practicable, this standard deals with the common hazards presented by appliances that are encountered by all persons in and around the home. However, in general, it does not take into account persons (including children) whose physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge prevents them from using the appliance safely without supervision or instruction or children playing with the appliance.

- **DNS/IEC 62612: 2013 Self ballasted LED lamps for general lighting services with supply voltages >50V – performance requirements**
