## SAINT LUCIA

---

**No. 10 of 2004**

**AN ACT** to provide for the Services of the State of Saint Lucia for the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, two thousand and five.

[ 27th May, 2004 ]

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly and the Senate of Saint Lucia, and by the authority of the same as follows:

**Short title**

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 2004/2005.

**Appropriation of \$768,564,320 for the Services of the State for the year 2004/2005**

2. There shall be and there is hereby granted to Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors for the year ending on the thirty first day of March, two thousand and five, the sum of seven hundred and sixty-eight million, five hundred and sixty four thousand, three hundred and twenty dollars, to be paid and appropriated out of the General Revenue and funds of the State for the said year in such quarterly amounts as the Minister may deem appropriate and to be approved and to be expended in the manner and for the purposes mentioned in the schedule to this Act.
