## SAINT LUCIA

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**No. 13 of 2004**

**AN ACT** to amend the Gaming Control Act No. 29 of 2000.

[18TH OCTOBER, 2004 ]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly and the Senate of Saint Lucia, and by the authority of the same as follows:

**Short title**

1. This Act may be cited as the Gaming Control (Amendment) Act, 2004.

**Addition to section 20**

2. Section 20 of the Gaming Control Act No. 29 of 2000 is amended by adding immediately after subsection (7) the following subsection (8) :

“(8) Notwithstanding subsection (7), the Board may recommend the grant of a gaming operator licence in respect of an applicant who does not operate a hotel containing two hundred and fifty rooms where the applicant undertakes to operate premises at which at least two hundred persons will be employed.”

**Addition to section 22**

3. Section 22 of the Gaming Control Act No. 29 of 2000 is amended by adding immediately after subsection (11) the following subsection (12) and (13) :

- “(12) Notwithstanding subsection (11), Cabinet may grant a gaming operator licence in respect of premises at which gaming is to take place which is not a hotel containing at least two hundred and fifty rooms if Cabinet is satisfied that at least two hundred persons will be continuously employed thereat;
- (13) Cabinet, after hearing the representations of a licensee, may revoke a licence granted under subsection (12) where a licensee does not employ at least two hundred persons.”.
