SAINT LUCIA

No. 16 of 2005

AN ACT to provide for the Services of the State of Saint Lucia for the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, two thousand and six.

[30th May, 2005]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly and the Senate of Saint Lucia, and by the authority of the same as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 2005/2006.

Appropriation of \$954,145,430 for the services of the State for the year 2005/2006

2. There shall be and there is hereby granted to Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors for the year ending on the thirty first day of March, two thousand and six, the sum of nine hundred and fifty four million, one hundred and forty five thousand, four hundred and thirty dollars, to be paid and appropriated out of the General Revenue and funds of the State for the said year in such quarterly amounts as the Minister may deem appropriate and to be approved and to be expended in the manner and for the purposes mentioned in the Schedule to this Act.
