**No. 29 of 2005**

**AN ACT** to amend the National Crime Commission Act 2003, No. 16 of 2003.

[ 21st November, 2005]

BEITENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly and the Senate of Saint Lucia, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

No. 29 ] *National Crime Commission (Amendment) Act* [ 2005.

**Short title**

**1.** This Act may be cited as the National Crime Commission (Amendment) Act 2005.

**Amendment of section 3**

**2.** Section 3 of the National Crime Commission Act 2003, No. 16 of 2003 is amended by –

- (a) deleting subsection (2) and substituting the following –
- “(2) The Commission shall comprise the following ten persons appointed by the Minister –
- (a) a representative of the Ministry of Education, Human Resource Development, Youth and Sports;
  - (b) a representative of the Saint Lucia Bar Association;
  - (c) a representative of the St. Lucia Hotel and Tourism Association;
  - (d) a representative of the Royal Saint Lucia Police Force;
  - (e) a representative of the Saint Lucia Christian Council;
  - (f) a representative of the Ministry responsible for Women’s Affairs;
  - (g) a representative of the Saint Lucia Security Industry Association;
  - (h) a representative of the media;
  - (i) a representative of the Private Sector; and
  - (j) a representative of the National Youth Council.”;
- (b) deleting the word “eight” appearing in subsection (6) and substituting the word “six”.
