SAINT LUCIA

No. 32 of 2006

AN ACT to make provision for the fulfillment of Saint Lucia's commitment to the efficient and effective staging of ICC Cricket World Cup West Indies 2007 and for related matters.

[21st November, 2006]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly and the Senate of Saint Lucia, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

PART 1
PRELIMINARY

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Cricket World Cup Act 2006.

Interpretation

2. In this Act —

“accredited media” means media accredited in writing by CWC 2007 Inc. to have access to areas within a CWC 2007 venue;

“accredited person” means a person accredited in writing by CWC 2007 Inc. to have access to areas within a CWC 2007 venue;

“advertisement” includes any written, illustrated, visual or other descriptive material or oral statement, communication, representation or reference distributed to members of the public or brought to their notice in any manner with the intention to —

- (a) promote the sale or leasing of goods, or encourage the use of goods or draw attention to the nature, properties, advantages, or uses of goods, or to the manner in, conditions on or prices at which goods may be purchased, leased or otherwise acquired; or
- (b) promote or encourage the use of any service, or draw attention to the nature, properties, advantages or uses of any service, or the manner in, conditions on, or prices at which any service is rendered or provided;

“authorised representative of CWC 2007 Inc.” means a person authorised in writing by CWC 2007 Inc. to represent CWC 2007 Inc.;

“CARICOM” means the Caribbean Community established pursuant to the Treaty of Chaguaramus establishing the Caribbean Community including the CARICOM Single Market and Economy signed in The Bahamas on the 5th July 2001;

“Commissioner” means the Commissioner of Police;

- “Committee” means the Local Organising Committee incorporated in Saint Lucia for the purposes of CWC 2007 as Company No. 71 of 2004;
- “CWC 2007” means the ICC Cricket World Cup West Indies 2007 including a CWC 2007 activity;
- “CWC 2007 activity” means a match or a CWC 2007 related function, event or other activity authorised by CWC 2007 Inc.;
- “CWC 2007 Inc.” means ICC Cricket World Cup West Indies 2007 Inc., a company incorporated in the British Virgin Islands;
- “CWC 2007 Inc. official” means the Chairman, Vice Chairman, members of the Board, Chief Executive Officer, Financial Controller, Secretary or Manager of CWC 2007 Inc.;
- “CWC 2007 mark” means a mark registered by CWC 2007 Inc. for the purpose of CWC 2007;
- “CWC official” means a person carrying on functions on behalf of CWC 2007 Inc.;
- “CWC 2007 ticket” means a ticket produced, issued or distributed by or on behalf of CWC 2007 Inc. permitting entry to a CWC 2007 venue or CWC 2007 activity and includes an accreditation by CWC 2007 Inc.;
- “CWC 2007 venue” means an area declared as such pursuant to section 3;
- “dangerous object” means any explosive or incendiary device or material, firearm, gas, material, weapon, glass of any description, or other article, object or instrument which may be used to maim, disfigure, disable or cause bodily harm or death to a person, or to render a person temporarily paralyzed or unconscious, or to cause damage to property, or any object that may be used as a missile and such other objects as may be prescribed as a dangerous object;
- “GCC” means Global Cricket Corporation Pte Limited, a company incorporated in Singapore as Company No. CRN200008431R and its successors or assigns;
- “ICC” means the International Cricket Council, a company limited by guarantee and incorporated in the British Virgin Islands as Company No. 9112;

“IDI” means ICC Development (International) Limited, a company incorporated in the British Virgin Islands as Company No. 90940;

“match” includes a warm-up match, forming part of CWC 2007 and includes any performance or formalities held or conducted in conjunction with the match;

“match period” means a period declared as such by the Minister pursuant to section 3;

“Minister” means the Minister responsible for Sports;

“official broadcaster” means a broadcaster appointed by IDI or GCC in relation to CWC 2007;

“official sponsor” means a sponsor appointed by CWC 2007 Inc. or GCC in relation to CWC 2007;

“official supplier” means a supplier of products or services appointed as an official supplier of such products or services for CWC 2007 by CWC 2007 Inc. or GCC;

“participating State” means a country listed in the Third Schedule;

“participating team” means an ICC member country team competing in CWC 2007;

“permitted entrant” means —

- (a) the holder of a valid CWC 2007 ticket that entitles the holder to be within specific areas of a CWC 2007 venue;
- (b) any other person who is, under a general or specific authorisation or accreditation granted by or on behalf of CWC 2007 Inc. or the Government of Saint Lucia, entitled to be in the CWC 2007 venue;

“permission” includes a licence, an accreditation, an approval and an authorisation;

“person” includes a body corporate or an unincorporated body;

“playing field” means the playing field at which a match is being played or is to be played and includes any area between the playing field and any structure intended to be a barrier between the players and the spectators;

“police officer” includes, a special constable or a peace officer appointed pursuant to the Police Act, Cap.14.01;

“Regulations” means Regulations made pursuant to this Act;

“security officer” means a person licensed as a security officer pursuant to the Private Security Act, and appointed by CWC 2007 Inc., for the purpose of providing security services at a CWC 2007 activity;

“sign” includes a word, including a personal name, design, letter, numeral, colour, or combination of colours or the shape of goods or their packaging;

“squad” means the members of a participating team comprising such number of players and officials as determined by IDI;

“stadium” means the whole premises of any stadium, ground or place at which any match or the opening or closing ceremony of CWC 2007 is scheduled to take place;

“tax” includes a tax, duty, fee, levy or surcharge;

“vehicle” means a conveyance that is designed to be propelled or drawn by any means, whether or not capable of being so propelled or drawn;

“WICB” means the West Indies Cricket Board Inc., a company incorporated in the British Virgin Islands as Company No. 302180.

(2) For the purposes of this Act “a person taking part in a CWC 2007 activity” means —

- (a) a member of a squad;
- (b) a person, including an umpire or a match referee, engaged in the control or management of the CWC 2007 activity;
- (c) a police officer;
- (d) a security officer;
- (e) an authorised representative of CWC 2007 Inc.;
- (f) an accredited person;
- (g) a member of a class of persons authorised to enter the playing field; or
- (h) a person involved in the production or transmission or both or the broadcast of a CWC 2007 activity, whether by television, radio, telecommunication or wireless service or otherwise.

PART 2

CWC 2007 SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS

Declaration of CWC 2007 venue and match period

3.— (1) Subject to subsection (2) and to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary, the Minister may, after consultation with the Committee, by notice published in the Gazette and in at least one newspaper in general and at least weekly circulation in Saint Lucia, declare —

- (a) any area reasonably required for the staging of a CWC 2007 activity, as a CWC 2007 venue in respect of the period specified in the notice which shall not extend beyond the date of expiry of this Act; and
- (b) a period specified in the notice as the match period.

(2) The Minister shall not declare as a CWC 2007 venue —

- (a) an airport or a seaport;
- (b) any area which is a protected, reserved or restricted area pursuant to any other law in force in Saint Lucia; or
- (c) a private property, unless with the agreement of the owner of that private property-
 - (i) for the acquisition of that property; and
 - (ii) as to the amount of the compensation payable for the acquisition of that property.

(4) A notice pursuant to subsection (1) shall state the reason for the declaration.

(5) For the purposes of this section —

“acquisition” has the meaning given to it pursuant to section 6 of the Constitution of Saint Lucia, Cap. 1.01;

“private property” means property not belonging to the Crown.

Effect of Declaration of CWC 2007 venue

4. Subject to the rights of the State or a public authority relating to national security, public order, public health or public safety, CWC

2007 Inc. shall, for the duration of a match period, have full control of a CWC 2007 venue in accordance with the provisions of this Act.

Exemption from taxes and duties on CWC 2007 tickets

5. Notwithstanding any law in force in Saint Lucia, to the contrary, CWC 2007 tickets shall be exempt from taxes and duties of every description.

Exemption from exchange control

6.— (1) Notwithstanding any law in force in Saint Lucia, income and benefits earned or derived in the course of, or arising from, CWC 2007 by —

- (a) CWC 2007 Inc., ICC, IDI, GCC and WICB;
- (b) a member of a squad;
- (c) a CWC 2007 official; or
- (d) a member of staff of ICC, IDI or GCC;

shall be exempt from foreign exchange restrictions.

(2) Subsection (1) shall apply in the case of a person ordinarily resident in Saint Lucia as it applies to any other person.

Banking

7. Notwithstanding any law in force in Saint Lucia to the contrary, a bank may open for business on any public holiday, Saturday or Sunday during a match period.

Sunday trading

8. Subject to the Liquor Licensing Act, Cap. 13.17 and notwithstanding any other law in force in Saint Lucia to the contrary, a shop may open for business on any Sunday or public holiday during a match period.

PART 3

CONDUCT IN A CWC 2007 VENUE

Deliveries

9.— (1) The Commissioner may, after consultation with the Committee, in relation to any match period, issue directions —

- (a) to regulate or prohibit the making of deliveries in a CWC 2007 venue;
- (b) to regulate or prohibit the loading or unloading of vehicles in a CWC 2007 venue;
- (c) to impose restrictions, relating to the standing, stopping, parking, loading, unloading of vehicles in a CWC 2007 venue; or
- (d) for the maintenance of national security in a CWC 2007 venue.

(2) A direction by the Commissioner pursuant to subsection (1) may apply —

- (a) to an entire CWC 2007 venue or to part of a CWC 2007 venue;
- (b) to vehicles in a specified class or description;
- (c) on such days during the match period as are specified in the direction;
- (d) during such periods on the days referred to in paragraph (c) as are specified in the direction; or
- (e) subject to conditions as are specified in the direction.

(3) A person shall not fail to comply with a direction of the Commissioner issued pursuant to this section.

(4) A person who contravenes subsection (3) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Entry to and exit from stadium

10.— (1) A person shall not enter a stadium during a match period unless that person is a permitted entrant.

(2) A person shall not enter or leave a stadium during a match period except through an entrance or exit designated by CWC 2007 Inc. or as otherwise permitted by CWC 2007 Inc.

(3) A person who contravenes any provision of this section commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars.

Unauthorised entry into a part of a CWC 2007 venue

11.— (1) Except with the authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc., a person shall not, during a match period, enter or be present in or on —

- (a) a part of a playing field;
- (b) any other part of a stadium if it is indicated that entry into that part is not permitted; or
- (c) any part of a CWC 2007 venue if it is indicated that entry into that part is not permitted.

(2) For the purposes of subsection (1)(b) and (c), an indication that entry is not permitted may be given in any one or more of the following ways:

- (a) an advertisement;
- (b) a pamphlet;
- (c) conditions attached to a CWC 2007 ticket;
- (d) a direction of a police officer or a security officer;
- (e) a fence, chain or barrier around the part or across an entrance into the part;
- (f) a sign.

(3) A person who contravenes subsection (1), may be —

- (a) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave a CWC 2007 venue, or part of a CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) removed from the CWC 2007 venue or part of a CWC 2007 venue by a police officer if that person refuses to comply with an order under paragraph (a).

(4) Notwithstanding an order to leave or a removal pursuant to subsection (3), a person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Reserved areas and reserved seats

12.— (1) CWC 2007 Inc. may, for the duration of a match period, set aside —

- (a) any area within a CWC 2007 venue as a reserved area for CWC 2007 Inc.; or
- (b) any area or seat within a CWC 2007 venue as a reserved area or seat.

(2) CWC 2007 Inc. may issue a CWC 2007 ticket or an authorisation entitling a person to —

- (a) enter and remain in a reserved area; or
- (b) occupy a reserved seat;

in a CWC 2007 venue for a specified period.

(3) A person shall not enter or remain in a reserved area or occupy a reserved seat in a CWC 2007 venue unless that person is —

- (a) authorised by CWC 2007 Inc. to do so; or
- (b) the holder of a CWC 2007 ticket conferring entitlement to do so.

(4) A police officer or a security officer who has reasonable grounds to suspect that a person has contravened subsection (3), may request that the person produce evidence of his or her entitlement to enter or remain in a reserved area or to occupy a reserved seat in a CWC 2007 venue.

(5) A person who, at the request of a police officer or security officer, fails to produce evidence of his or her entitlement to enter or remain in the reserved area or to occupy the reserved seat, may be—

- (a) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave the reserved area, reserved seat or CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) removed from the reserved area, reserved seat or CWC 2007 venue by a police officer, if that person refuses to comply with an order under paragraph (a).

(6) A person who contravenes subsection (3) commits an offence and, notwithstanding any order to leave or removal pursuant to subsection (4), is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars.

Conduct

13.— (1) A person shall not in a CWC 2007 venue —

- (a) misuse, deface, damage or tamper with any building, passage, seat, chair, table, structure, vehicle, craft, truck, pipe, tap, tap-fitting, conduit, electrical equipment, wiring, sign or the fitting;
- (b) excavate or cause to be excavated any part of a CWC 2007 venue unless duly authorised;
- (c) erect any structure, or erect or display any sign, banner or other thing in contravention of this Act unless duly authorised;
- (d) block any stair, step, aisle, gangway, overpass, underpass, pontoon, bridge, entry, exit or other thoroughfare unless duly authorised.;
- (e) throw any stone, bottle or missile, or throw or use any other dangerous object;
- (f) disrupt, interrupt, or behave in a manner that may disrupt or interrupt, any CWC 2007 activity, or disrupt or interfere with the health, safety, comfort or enjoyment of persons at a CWC 2007 activity;
- (g) interfere with the equipment of a person taking part in a CWC 2007 activity;
- (h) operate or use a loud hailer, public address system or broadcast device, or any other device that may interfere with electronic or radio communications unless duly authorised;
- (i) conduct public surveys or opinion polls, or solicit money, donations or subscriptions from members of the public unless duly authorised; or
- (j) act or conduct himself in such a way as to —
 - (i) adversely affect the health or safety of the public within the stadium or other CWC 2007 venue;
 - (ii) interfere with any person taking part in a CWC 2007 activity; or
 - (iii) interfere with the equipment of a person taking part in a CWC 2007 activity; or
 - (iv) adversely affect the efficient operation and staging of a CWC 2007 activity.

(2) Where an authorisation pursuant to subsection (1)(h) is revoked, the person concerned shall immediately submit the device to a police officer or a security officer.

(3) A police officer may dismantle or remove any structure erected or any sign, banner or other thing displayed in contravention of this section.

(4) A person who contravenes subsection (1) or (2), may be —

- (a) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave the CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) removed from the CWC 2007 venue by a police officer from the CWC 2007 venue, if that person refuses to comply with an order under paragraph (a).

(5) Notwithstanding an order to leave or a removal pursuant to subsection (4), a person who contravenes subsection (1) or (3) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars.

(6) A police officer may seize anything capable of being used to contravene this section.

(7) Anything seized pursuant to subsection (6) is liable to forfeiture on conviction, pursuant to this section, of the person from whom it was seized.

Prohibited items

14.— (1) A person shall not bring a prohibited item into, or have a prohibited item in his or her possession in, a CWC 2007 venue during a match period unless that person is a police officer on duty and is authorised in writing by the Commissioner to do so.

(2) A police officer or a security officer may request a person to surrender a prohibited item which is in that person's possession at a security point or an entrance of a CWC 2007 venue.

(3) A person who refuses to surrender a prohibited item when requested to do so pursuant to subsection (2) shall be denied entry to the CWC 2007 venue.

(4) A police officer shall seize a prohibited item brought into a CWC 2007 venue.

(5) A prohibited item seized pursuant to subsection (4) is liable to forfeiture on conviction, pursuant to this section, of a person from whom it was seized.

(6) A person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year.

(7) For the purposes of this section “prohibited item” means an item listed in the First Schedule.

Restricted items

15.— (1) Except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc. or the Commissioner, a person shall not bring a restricted item into, or have a restricted item in his or her possession in, a CWC 2007 venue during a match period.

(2) A police officer or a security officer may request a person to surrender a restricted item —

- (a) which is in that person’s possession at a security point or entrance of a CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) which has been brought into or remains in a CWC 2007 venue in contravention of subsection (1).

(3) A person who refuses to surrender a restricted item when requested to do so pursuant to —

- (a) subsection (2)(a) may be denied entry to the CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) subsection (2)(b), may be —
 - (i) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave the CWC 2007 venue; or
 - (ii) removed from the CWC 2007 venue by a police officer, if that person refuses to comply with an order pursuant to sub paragraph (i).

(4) Where an authorisation pursuant to subsection (1) is revoked, the person concerned shall immediately —

- (a) remove or surrender the restricted item to a police officer; or
- (b) if ordered by a police officer or a security officer, leave the CWC 2007 venue.

(5) Notwithstanding an order to leave or a removal pursuant to subsection (3), a person who contravenes subsection (1) or (4) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars.

(6) For the purposes of this section “restricted item” means an item specified in the Second Schedule.

Sale of goods or services

16.— (1) Except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc., a person shall not —

- (a) hawk, sell, offer, advertise, display for sale or distribute to members of the public, any goods or services; or
- (b) collect money or orders from members of the public for goods or services;

in a CWC 2007 venue during a match period.

- (2) A person who contravenes subsection (1), may be —
 - (a) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave the CWC 2007 venue; or
 - (b) removed from the CWC 2007 venue by a police officer, if that person refuses to comply with an order under paragraph (a).

(3) Notwithstanding an order to leave or a removal pursuant to subsection (2), a person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Control of advertisements

17.— (1) Subject to rights existing at the date of commencement of this Act and notwithstanding any law in force in Saint Lucia to the contrary, except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc., a person shall not cause or authorise an advertisement or advertising

material to be displayed or fixed to or placed on or remain on or above any land or building or structure in a CWC 2007 venue.

(2) CWC 2007 Inc., may erase, cover or remove or cause or authorise the erasure, coverage or removal of an advertisement or advertising material fixed or placed on any land building or structure in a CWC 2007 venue in contravention of subsection (1).

(3) In exercising the powers conferred pursuant to subsection (2), CWC 2007 Inc. shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure that minimum damage as possible is caused.

(4) Notwithstanding subsection (2), a person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars.

(5) An authorisation pursuant to subsection (1) shall not have the effect of dispensing with the requirement of obtaining permission where such permission is required pursuant to any other law in force in Saint Lucia.

PART 4 CONTROL OF ACTIVITIES

False or misleading advertisements

18.— (1) A person shall not publish or display, or cause or authorise the publication or display of any advertisement that relates to or is connected with CWC 2007 which is false or misleading.

(2) A person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction —

- (a) in the case of a first conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars; or
- (b) in the case of a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand dollars.

Sale and distribution of CWC 2007 tickets

19.— (1) CWC 2007 Inc. shall be responsible for the production, issue and distribution of CWC 2007 tickets.

(2) A person shall not, except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc. —

- (a) sell by wholesale, retail, auction or tender;
- (b) hire;
- (c) barter or exchange;
- (d) supply for profit;
- (e) offer for sale or hire, receive for sale or hire, have in possession for sale or hire, or expose or exhibit for sale or hire;
- (f) conduct negotiations for sale or hire;
- (g) consign or deliver for sale or hire; or
- (h) solicit for sale or hire;

a CWC 2007 ticket, or an article that is represented to be a CWC 2007 ticket for admission to a CWC 2007 activity.

(3) A person shall not cause or authorise the doing of any thing referred to in subsection (2).

(4) A person who contravenes subsection (2) or (3) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars.

Commercial broadcasting, telecasting, recording or filming of a CWC 2007 activity

20.— (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (7), except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc., a person shall not wilfully, otherwise than for personal use —

- (a) broadcast, narrowcast, telecast, transmit, record, publish, disseminate, reproduce or circulate by any means, including, without limitation, utilising television, radio, satellite, telecommunication or any wireless service, any audio, video, photograph, text or data or any other information relating to a CWC 2007 activity or any part of a CWC 2007 activity; or
- (b) authorise or cause the doing of anything referred to in paragraph (a).

(2) An application for authorisation pursuant to this section shall be made to CWC 2007 Inc. in such form and manner as may be determined by CWC 2007 Inc.

(3) An authorisation pursuant to this section shall —

- (a) be subject to such conditions as CWC 2007 Inc. thinks fit;
- (b) not have the effect of dispensing with the necessity of obtaining permission where such permission is required pursuant to any other law in force in Saint Lucia.

(4) A police officer may take possession of any article that is used in contravention of this section if —

- (a) the police officer has directed the person concerned to stop the use of the article; and
- (b) despite the direction, the person continued to use the article in contravention of this section.

(5) A person who contravenes subsection (1), may be —

- (a) ordered by a police officer or a security officer to leave the CWC 2007 venue; or
- (b) removed from the CWC 2007 venue by a police officer if that person refuses to comply with an order under paragraph (a);

(6) Notwithstanding an order to leave or a removal pursuant to subsection (5), a person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of ten thousand dollars.

(7) Notwithstanding subsection (1), and subject to subsection (8), the broadcasting, telecasting, recording or filming of any information relating to a CWC 2007 activity for the purpose of provision of information or for the purpose of criticism or review is not by itself sufficient to amount to a contravention of subsection (1).

(8) In subsection (7), a reference to —

- (a) the provision of information includes a reference to reporting of news and the presentation of current affairs;
- (b) criticism or review includes a reference to criticism or review in a —
 - (i) newspaper, magazine or similar periodical;
 - (ii) broadcast; or
 - (iii) film.

Dealing with article taken under section 20

21.— (1) A police officer, on taking possession of an article under section 20, shall—

- (a) give a receipt to the person from whom it was taken, indicating the nature of the article and the date and time when possession of it was taken by the police officer;
- (b) notify the person of the place at which and the time within which the article can be collected if the person is not charged with an offence under section 20(6).

(2) The article referred to in subsection (1) shall be —

- (a) lodged with CWC 2007 Inc.; and
- (b) be available for collection within seventy-two hours after the taking of possession pursuant to section 20;

unless the person from whom it was taken is charged with an offence under section 20(6) within seventy-two hours after the taking of possession in which case the article is deemed to be seized and is liable to forfeiture on conviction of that person.

Restriction on certain activities

22. — (1) Subject to any rights existing at the date of commencement of this Act, except with the written authorisation of CWC 2007 Inc., a person shall not wilfully make, use, broadcast, display, publish or televise any advertisement, communication, statement, mark or image or cause or authorise any advertisement, communication or statement mark or image to be made, used, broadcast, displayed, published or televised that —

- (a) relates to or is connected with CWC 2007 and implies or suggests a contractual or other connection or association of that person with CWC 2007 or a person officially associated or involved in CWC 2007;
- (b) is intended to —
 - (i) exploit CWC 2007 or the publicity or goodwill of CWC 2007 in order for that person to gain a benefit of any kind;
 - (ii) associate the person with CWC 2007 or the publicity or goodwill of CWC 2007 in order for that person to gain a benefit of any kind;

- (iii) diminish the status of an official sponsor, official supplier, official broadcaster or other licensee in regard to CWC 2007; or
- (iv) imply that the person is an official sponsor, official supplier, official broadcaster or other licensee with regard to CWC 2007.

(2) A person who contravenes subsection (1) commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction for a first offence to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, and for a second or subsequent offence to fine not exceeding forty thousand dollars.

(3) For the purposes of this section —

- (a) “image” includes the visual or aural representation; and
- (b) “mark” includes—
 - (i) a CWC 2007 mark; and
 - (ii) the name of a stadium, CWC 2007 venue, or the name of a participating State used together with the words “2007” or a CWC 2007 mark.

PART 5 MISCELLANEOUS

Regulations

23. The Minister may make Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Act.

Amendment of Schedules

24. The Minister may, by Order published in the Gazette, amend the First Schedule, Second Schedule, or Third Schedule.

Act to bind the State

25. This Act binds the State.

Expiry of Act

26. This Act expires on the 30th day of June 2007.
