TERMS OF REFERENCE

COMMUNITY LIAISON OFFICER

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.01 The UK Caribbean Infrastructure Fund (UKCIF) is a 330 million pound infrastructure fund which aims to have a tangible impact on nine beneficiary countries in the Caribbean through investment in economic infrastructure. The project is funded by the UK Government through the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and is managed by the Caribbean Development Bank. UKCIF includes a strong focus on promoting the social and economic benefits from the infrastructure provision, and effectively managing any related risks.
- 1.02 Saint Lucia (SLU) is a beneficiary country of UKCIF. The Government of Saint Lucia (GOSL) is seeking to utilise its allocated UKCIF funding to help finance road improvements along the Millennium Highway and West Coast Road (MHWCR) Corridor.
- 1.03 There are significant benefits to be realised from the Project but there are also a range of social and environmental safeguard issues that were identified

through the Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) which must be managed during implementation. In this regard, the engagement of a Community Liaison Officer (CLO) is imperative to support the Project Coordinator (PC) and the Project Management Unit in managing the safeguard aspects of the Project. This critical input is intended to increase the likelihood of realising the project's intended outcomes.

2. OBJECTIVE/OUTCOME

2.01 The expected outcomes of the Project are:

- (a) A socially-inclusive management and planning framework for the road sector in Saint Lucia.
- (b) Increased efficiency, resilience and improved safety of MHWCR.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES

3.01 The CLO will promote constructive partnerships and communication between Department of Infrastructure, Ports and Energy (DIPE) and the communities on issues relating to project implementation and will be responsible for implementing community engagement activities as set out in the Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP). Among other activities, CLO will:

- (g) Manage community members' expectations of the project during scheduled meetings and ad-hoc interaction, as necessary.
- (h) Identify potential grievances or project risks and/or opportunities.
- (i) Assist Resettlement Action Committee with management of, and timely responses to grievances lodged through the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) of the SEP.
- (j) Liaise with contractors as needed (e.g. during the local labour recruitment process by assisting with drafting gender-responsive local hiring policies and procedures) especially where community requirements are being solicited.
- (k) Raise awareness of employment opportunities, especially for vulnerable groups in the society and within the Project areas including women, youth and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).
- (l) Manage stakeholder engagement logistics such as soliciting suggestions/grievances from suggestion boxes, placing communication materials on notice boards and via social media, and arranging community meetings.
