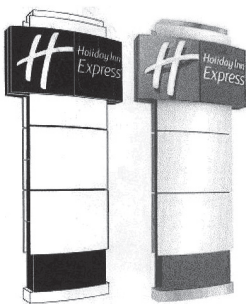

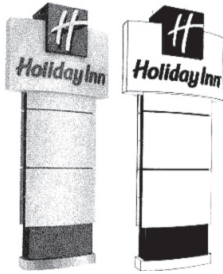

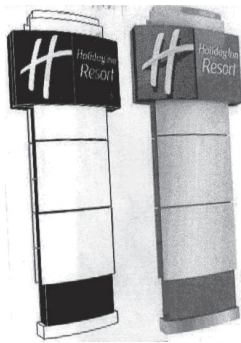

## Antibody test faster, cheaper than DNA profiling



Federal researchers say they have developed a human identification test that's faster and possibly cheaper than DNA testing.

It would be a handy new weapon in the arsenal for detectives, forensic experts and the military, though no one expects it to replace DNA analysis -- and its promoters say it is not intended to.

The new method analyzes antibodies. Each person has a unique antibody bar code that can be gleaned from blood, saliva or other bodily fluids. Antibodies are proteins used by the body to fend off viruses or perform routine physiological housekeeping.

"DNA is a physical code that describes you ... and in many ways so are your antibodies," said Dr. Vicki Thompson, a chemical engineer at the Idaho National Laboratory who's been working with other researchers to perfect the test for the past 10 years.

The scientists say an antibody profile can yield results faster and more cheaply and be

performed in the field with minimal training. National lab administrators have licensed the technology exclusively to Identity Sciences LLC in Alpharetta, Georgia.

The Georgia startup plans to begin rolling out test kits and training to law enforcement, the military and forensic and medical labs around the globe by fall of 2009. Ken Haas, vice president of marketing, says the test is not intended to supplant DNA testing, the recognized gold standard in human identification.

But Haas says the value of antibody profiling is as a screening tool to help make sense of a crime scene, sort out the blood trails or spatter from multiple victims or more quickly identify body parts on a battlefield or at the scene of a disaster like the September 11, 2001 attacks.

It may also reduce the number of DNA tests required in an investigation, potentially saving time and money and easing the growing backlog, he said. Results from tests on blood serum or dried blood can be ready in two hours, a fraction of the time it takes to run similar tests for DNA matches.

However, a major drawback for now is the lack of a national antibody database. That's one of the reasons antibody testing is not likely to be used at the outset of an investigation to link suspects to crimes or establish probable cause to justify issuing an arrest warrant.

Company officials say beta testing by forensic scientists at simulated crime scenes

at seven locations across the country has produced positive results and reinforced the notion that an eager market awaits. The company declined to say where the testing occurred, citing nondisclosure agreements with participants.

The company has not yet put a price tag on the field kits. But executives say their product will be significantly cheaper than DNA analysis, which can run anywhere from \$500 (euro320) to \$3,000 (euro1,925) per sample because it requires sophisticated equipment and lab time.

"We don't see this yet as a product to take to court," said Gene Venesky, vice president of Identity Sciences. "But we do see this as a way to get the case moving forward toward a final, legal resolution."

Still, some forensics experts say that kind of scrutiny may be unavoidable, especially if the test takes on a bigger crime-fighting role.

"There is a lot of potential here," said Lawrence Kobilinsky, a DNA expert and chairman of the Department of Forensic Science at John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York. "Any time you can develop a quick and easy screen for something ... that is a good thing."

But Kobilinsky and others caution that it takes time for any new forensic test to gain acceptance where it matters most -- state and federal courthouses. If the new tests begin appearing in police reports, defense attorneys can be expected to challenge their validity.



### ECSE

#### Eastern Caribbean

On the ECSE, 3,225 shares of Cable & Wireless St Kitts & Nevis traded at \$7.50. Also, shares of ECFH, St Kitts Nevis Anguilla National Bank and Bank of Nevis traded all unchanged from their previous market close.

### TRINIDAD

The TTSE recorded an advance decline ratio of 16 to 8 last week. Neal & Massy recorded the biggest upward price movement, advancing by \$1.64, while Scotiabank led the decliners. NCB Jamaica emerged volume leader followed by Sagicor and RBTT, with the three accounting for 48% of total volumes traded.

Rum and other spirits sales increased for Angostura, but a once-lucrative business deal gone sour led to the company posting a \$137.3 million after-tax loss in 2007. The net loss means that Angostura shareholders will receive no further dividends for that financial period.

### JAMAICA

In News from Jamaica, all three JSE indices advanced. Of the 36 stocks traded, 18 advanced, 10 declined and 8 traded firm. Jamaica Broilers Ltd. was the volume leader with over 20% of the week's activity followed by Gleaner Company and Supreme Ventures Limited.

Having not secured a replacement for Danish shipping firm, Maersk, the Port Authority of Jamaica is seeing its volumes fall off even while costs and capacity rise. The Port's total income increased marginally over the review period, resulting in a \$200 million reduction in operating surplus.

### BARBADOS

All three Barbados indices advanced last week. The Regular Market traded a total volume topping 702,000 shares. The top three traded companies were Banks Holdings Limited which accounted for the bulk of the activity at 76%, followed by Neal & Massy Holdings and Sagicor Financial Corporation.

In related news, Sagicor has put shareholders on notice that America's sub-prime mortgage crisis and economic recession will likely impact the markets in which the Barbados-based company

operates. Sagicor's chairman warned that the company could soon be feeling the pinch from the US economic slowdown which was expected to last throughout 2008. He also noted the company fell short in attaining the group's revenue target as a result of one of its US based subsidiaries failing to meet its own revenue target.

### INTERNATIONAL

Internationally, U.S. stocks posted the biggest weekly gain in almost three months after oil prices reached new highs and Google, Intel and JP Morgan reported better-than-expected earnings.

The dollar touched an all-time low against the euro on speculation the European Central Bank won't follow the Federal Reserve in cutting interest rates.

Rice futures rose for a fifth day, recording the biggest weekly advance in at least seven years, on concern export curbs imposed by China and Vietnam will spread as importing nations struggle to meet their needs.

And finally, crude oil and gasoline climbed to records as better-than-expected earnings signaled a strengthening US economy that may boost demand.

# SPORTS

## CRICKET

### We had issues with these two - Arthur

A day after the Indian Premier League (IPL) banned Harbhajan Singh for slapping Sreesanth after a match in Mohali on Friday, it has emerged that the behaviour of both players had come under the scanner during the recent South Africa series in India, too.

Harbhajan had to apologise to Ashwell Prince, the South African batsman, for abusing him during the third Test of that series in Kanpur last month and the South Africans "lost a lot of respect for Sreesanth" when he went after AB de Villiers, Mickey Arthur, the South Africa coach, told Cricinfo.

Asked about the IPL incident, Arthur said he was not surprised because "when there are two such volatile players on the field, anything can happen."

Harbhajan was banned on Monday from the first season of the IPL after Farokh Engineer, the match referee, found him

guilty of slapping Sreesanth. The BCCI has initiated a separate probe into the incident.

"At the end of the day, we are not squealers," Arthur said. "We strongly believe that what happens on the field stays on it. Besides, we were very happy with the general spirit in which the series was played in, and we left with very pleasant memories of the tour, especially the cricket that was played."

However, Arthur admitted that the behaviour of Harbhajan and Sreesanth during the India series "was not great" and said that the South Africans took up the Kanpur incident because Prince felt very strongly about it. "There was an incident in Kanpur. There was a hearing by the match referee (Roshan Mahanama) during which Harbhajan apologised to Prince. It was settled and we were happy with the apology. I am not 100 per cent sure what was said. But Ashwell felt very strongly about it at that time and that's why we took it up," Arthur said.

"Sreesanth was just Sreesanth. Perhaps our players lost a lot of respect for him on the tour. He constantly abused AB de Villiers and it was very personal. But considering the general spirit in which the

series was played, we didn't feel strongly enough to complain," he said.

South Africa's three-Test tour of India ended in a 1-1 draw after the visitors won the second Test in Ahmedabad by an innings and 90 runs before India came back strongly to level the series in Kanpur.

## FOOTBALL

### Angry Drogba hits back at Benitez

Chelsea striker Didier Drogba says he has lost respect for Rafael Benitez after the Liverpool boss claimed he had a dossier of his 'diving' antics.

Ahead of the sides' Champions league semi-final second leg, Drogba furiously hit back at the accusation.

Drogba told French newspaper L'Equipe: "Benitez was a manager I respected a lot. He has really disappointed me.

"Until now, I found him very competent and also classy. A top boss would never go so low to attack a player."

Drogba came in for criticism over his conduct following last week's first leg, which finished 1-1.

But the Ivory Coast international believes it is unjustified and suspects the motives behind Benitez's comments.

"Perhaps he is looking for something to destabilise us before the match," Drogba said.

He added: "If he wants me to stay on my feet, maybe he should tell his defenders to stop hitting

me. "In the first leg, (Jamie) Carragher and the other one (Martin Skrtel) didn't stop. And not just with me. I finished the match with bruises everywhere.

"Last year, I broke a rib against Liverpool in the Champions League semi-final. Strangely, that escapes the statistics of Benitez.

"It will not affect me. If I fall, I will always get up. The best response I can give will be on the pitch."

Chelsea boss Avram Grant has already defended his player, insisting Drogba is not a cheat.

Grant said: "I don't think he is a diver at all. He's a good player. He's a powerful player, so the referee needs to look at what happens to him more."

"He looks so powerful, defenders think there are other ways to stop him.

But Grant feels Benitez is playing mind games and instead turned the focus on the defensive tactics used by Liverpool's defenders against Drogba in that game.

"If you look at the video and see what Jamie Carragher did to him in the first game, you will see the referee was very polite," said Grant.

"In the first half of the first game, the referee could easily have given a yellow card to Carragher to get him banned for this match.

"It could have been offside for Ryan Babel in the build-up to their goal, even if he was not involved in the goal."

"I think he (Benitez) is trying to take attention from this.

"Rafa can say whatever he wants to say. I say

what I think. Ask him why he's saying that. I think the reason is clear.

"One way to stop him is to use power more than ever. I think he has tried to affect the referee so he does not do his job."

Liverpool had the relative luxury of resting players when they drew with Birmingham at the weekend, while Chelsea fought hard to overcome Premier League title rivals Manchester United on Saturday.

But Grant says he was happier to play a meaningful match instead of going through the motions and wants a repeat result.

"First, I am very glad that we had a game that was important for us and we didn't need to rest players," said Grant.

"Of course, it's sometimes an advantage, but I don't think it will disturb us when it comes to the game. "On Saturday we wanted to show that we can play like champions. We wanted to do that. But this is another game, a Champions League semi-final. We want to do it in this game."

Chelsea have never gone beyond the last four of the Champions League and Grant says he is determined to see his side crowned European champions this term.

"The dream of everybody is the Champions League," Grant explained. "This is the top. We've gone a long, long way. It has not been easy up to this game.

"The target is the Champions League, for sure. You cannot say it's more important than other competitions, but it's very important for the club and I'm here to sell the club.
