Terms of Reference for Consultant to Conduct Independent Audit of Dredging Fee Account

1.0 Background

The National Utilities Regulatory Commission (NURC), established by the National Utilities Regulatory Commission Act No. 3 of 2016, is responsible for the regulation of water supply services, sewerage services and electricity supply services in Saint Lucia.

As the economic regulator for water supply services and sewerage services, the NURC is responsible for establishing, approving, reviewing and monitoring tariff schemes and tariffs in accordance with the Water and Sewerage Act Cap 9.03 as amended by the NURC Act.

Following the establishment of a functioning water regulator in 2012 an extraordinary tariff review undertaken in 2013 set new water and sewerage rates for the period April 2013 to September 2015 (remainder of triennial period September 2012 to August 2015). This tariff review resulted in a 66.15% increase in water rates. Of this increase, 10.43% (reduced to 6.28% from September 2019 onwards) was apportioned as a dredging fee to be used for the dredging of the John Compton Dam which became heavily silted following Hurricane Tomas in 2010. The dredging fee was initially implemented for a two-year period, based on the timeframe estimated by the former National Water and Sewerage Commission (NWSC) as necessary for WASCO to recover the XCD \$6,000,000 projected for the completion of the dam dredging project. Recognizing that the fee was established solely to fund this initiative, the NWSC decided to implement specific conditions for its management. These included the creation of a ring-fenced account dedicated exclusively to the project, which would be subject to oversight and monitoring by the regulator.

To safeguard consumer interests the NWSC decided to strengthen the NURC's monitoring of the dredging fee by prescribing additional "Conditions for Managing the Dredging Fee" in 2015. These conditions became effective after publication in the Gazette of May 18, 2015. Subsequently the NURC published "Additional Conditions for Managing the Dredging Fee" in the Gazette of July 27, 2020. The most significant of these additional conditions was that the cost for the John Compton Dam Rehabilitation Project was capped at XCD\$60,120,265. Additionally, the amount allowed for recovery from January 2019 onwards remains at XCD\$26,638,647.21 as determined by the NURC.

In keeping with the requirement for the "Dredging Fee Account" to be subjected to an Annual Independent Audit by an independent auditor to be approved by the regulator, an independent auditor was contracted for years 2019 to 2022 as well as to account for previous years.

2.0 Objective/Description of the assignment

Cognizant of the requirement for an annual independent audit of the "Dredging Fee Account", the NURC is seeking to initiate an independent audit of the "Dredging Fee Account" for the period 2023 to 2025.

The NURC is therefore seeking a suitably qualified auditor to conduct said audit.

3.0 Scope of Services

The consultancy services required are for the following tasks:

Task 1: Obtain the receipts and disbursements listing which management states is a complete listing of the receipts and disbursements of the Dredging Fee Account for the period January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2025.

Task 2: Select 75% of the transactions from the receipts and disbursements listing in procedures 1 occurring during the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 and perform the following:

- i. Trace the selected transactions to supporting documentation (e.g invoices and contracts) and proof of payment.
- ii. Enquire of management whether the expenditure for the selected transactions was necessary for the Dredging of the Dam whether the expenditure had to be incurred for the contracted activities.
- iii. Obtain supporting documentation to substantiate whether the selected transactions were procured through a competitive bidding process. For any transactions that did not follow the competitive bidding process, enquire of management the rationale for not procuring the affected transactions through a competitive bidding process.
- iv. For any of the selected transactions in excess of XCD\$25,000, obtain supporting documentation showing that the related disbursements and contracts or other formal agreements were dated as submitted to the NURC before the date of the related disbursements.
- v. Trace selected transactions to budgeted amounts consistent with the cost cap determined by the NURC.

Task 3: Obtain WASCO's monthly cash receipts for customers' bill payments which management states is a complete listing of customers' bill payments for the period January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2025.

- i. Recalculate the percentage of WASCO's receipts for customers' bill payments to be allocated to the Dredging Fund account and compare the calculated amount to the receipt and disbursements listing.
- ii. Trace the allocated receipts from the receipt and disbursements listing to the bank statements of the Dredging Fund account - Bank of St. Lucia account number 909865000.
- iii. Obtain a bank confirmation of the balance of the Dredging Fund account (Bank of St. Lucia account number 909865000) as at December 31, 2023, December 31, 2024, and December 31, 2025.
