

Tourism Incentives (The Landings Limited) Order

SAINT LUCIA

STATUTORY INSTRUMENT, 2012, No. 99

In exercise of the power conferred under sections 3 and 8 of the Tourism Incentives Act, Cap.15.30, the Minister responsible for tourism, with the approval of Cabinet, makes this Order:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Tourism Incentives (The Landings Limited) Order 2012.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, 'tourism project' means the construction, furnishing and equipping of The Landings Limited.

Declared benefit with regard to import duty and consumption tax

3.—(1) Subject to subsection (2) and section 4, the declared benefit with regard to import duty and consumption tax is a one hundred percent waiver of import duty and consumption tax on –

- (a) kitchen equipment, kitchenware, tableware, furniture, appliances, soft furnishings, air condition units, cutlery, drapery, linen and glassware, whether imported or purchased locally for the tourism project; and
- (b) building materials, fixtures and fittings, whether imported or purchased locally for the tourism project.

(2) The declared benefit in subsection (1) –

- (a) is applicable for a period of five years commencing on the 11th day of July, 2011 and terminating on the 10th day of July, 2016; and
- (b) is subject to the approval of a Bill of Quantities by the Ministry of Tourism, Heritage and Creative Industries

which must be submitted prior to the importation or local purchase of the items for the tourism project.

Conditions

4. The declared benefit in section 3 is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) that the management of The Landings Limited submits a bi-annual report to the Ministry of Tourism, Heritage and Creative Industries from the date of commencement of the tourism project;
- (b) that the Ministry of Tourism, Heritage and Creative Industries is informed of any changes, structural or otherwise related to the tourism project; and
- (c) that The Landings Limited complies with all other monitoring requirements of the Ministry of Tourism, Heritage and Creative Industries.
